Introduction

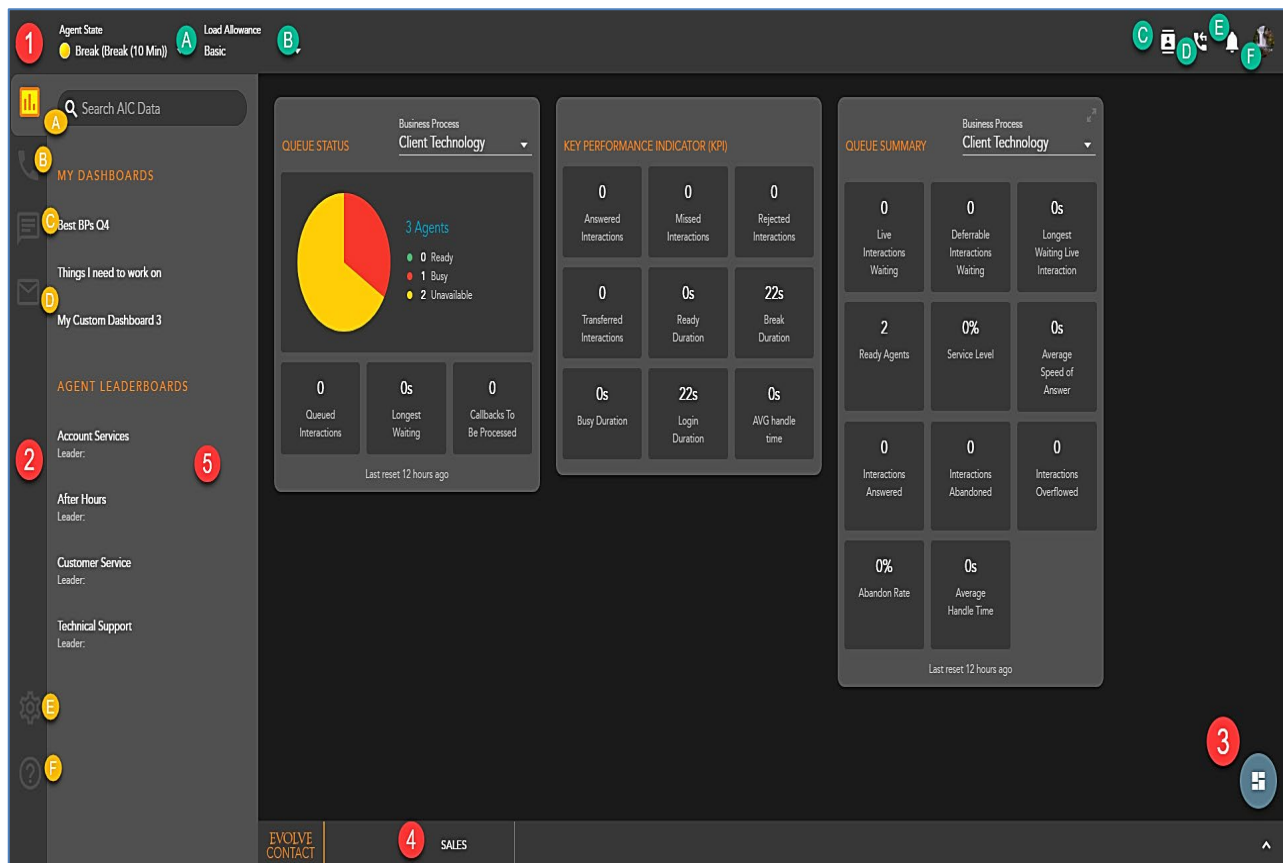
ECS Agent allows agents to use their browser to log in to ECS and respond to interactions.

Agents need a softphone endpoint like UC-One or Microsoft Teams for voice interactions. These clients are available for Windows, Mac, and mobile devices.

ECS Agent does not have native softphone capabilities.

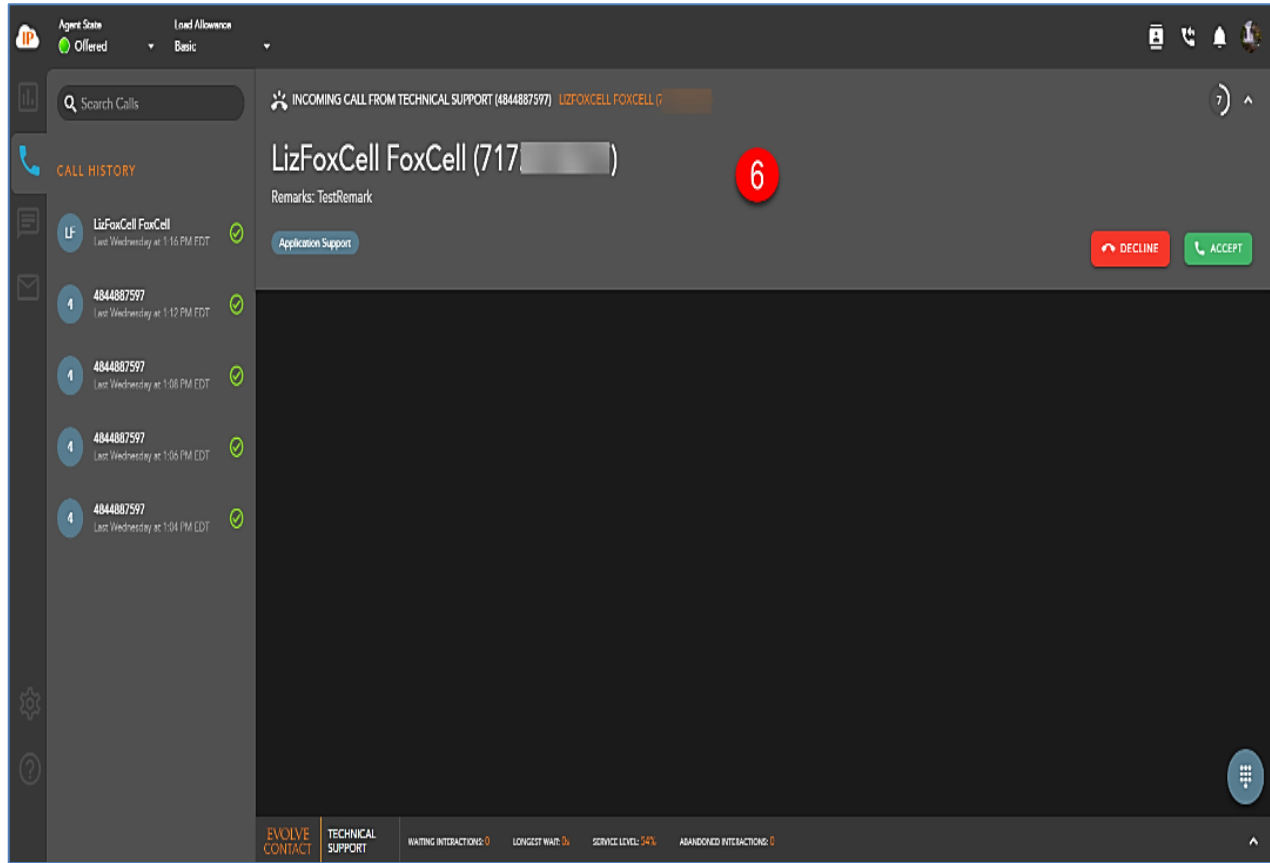
Overview

The Evolve Contact Suite Web Agent is an easy to use application designed specifically to meet the needs of contact center agents. It provides agents the features and functionality required to be efficient and productive in a omnichannel contact center.



1. **App Bar** - provides access to key application actions such as Agent State, Contacts, and Notifications
2. **Agent State** - Agent ACD State. Upon first login, the Agent State will always be Offline until manually updated by the agent.

3. **Load Allowance** - Agent's Load Allowance will default to what is configured in the Setup Client. The agent can manually update their load allowance from the drop down if multiple Load Allowances are available.
4. **Contacts** - Consists of an organization's internal contacts including agents, supervisors, Business Processes, channels, and Enterprise directory, as well as the contact centers external address book and CRM contacts.
5. **Callbacks** - Display and manage all agent pending callbacks
6. **Notifications** - Agent notifications
7. **Agent Information and Sign Out** - Basic Agent information, Avatar Management and Agent Sign Out
8. **App Side Bar** - provides high-level navigation between the different Interaction Types, the application settings, and application help
9. **Agent Intelligence Center** - Default view upon first login. Provides the agent with real time statistics on how the contact center is performing and general agent statistics.
10. **Telephony** - Access to Call History, Dial Pad, and all active Telephony interactions
11. **Chat** - Access to Chat History and active Chat Interactions
12. **Email** - Access to active email interactions. Email will be available in a future release.
13. **Settings** - Manage agent settings such as Theme, Ringtone, and Default Outgoing Business Process CallerID
14. **Help** - Help Content
15. **Floating Action Button** - Provides easy access to relevant actions such as Dashboard Setup with the Agent Intelligence Center or Access the Dialpad
16. **Stats Ticker** - Provides key contact center and agent metrics and the ability to drill into the details for each Business Process
17. **Interaction Side Bar** - Will display all active and historical interactions as well access to the Agent Intelligence Center



18. **Incoming Interaction Banner:** Provides notification and key information about an Interaction being offered such as: Interaction Type, Customer Name and DID or Email Address, Originating Business Process, Interaction Handling Remarks and Demands



19. **Interaction Toolbar** - Provides the most common Interaction handling actions such as transfer or conference
20. **Interaction Window** - Provides Interaction details
21. **Telephony Actions** - Provides call control actions such as hold/resume or mute
22. **Interaction Footer** - Provides navigation between the active interaction and the contact's information and history

General Agent Information

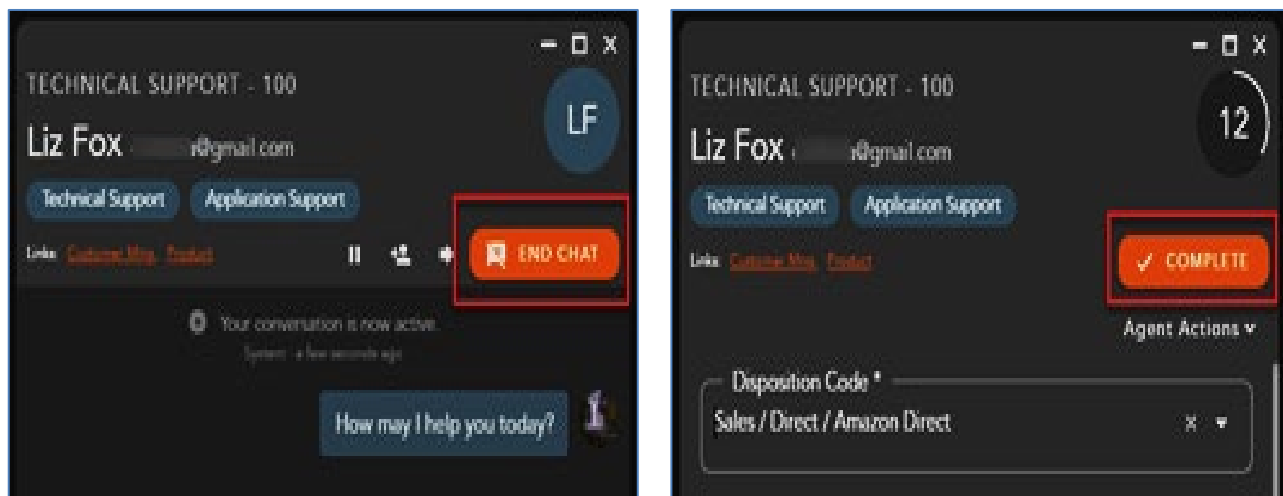
1. Only one instance of the Agent can be open at a time. If an attempt to open another tab of the client, the agent will be logged out of the client on the original tab.
2. If you do not put yourself into an Offline State or Sign Out of the Web Agent before exiting out of the browser tab, your agent state will remain active for 30 seconds, before the system automatically puts you into an offline state.

How do I finish an Interaction

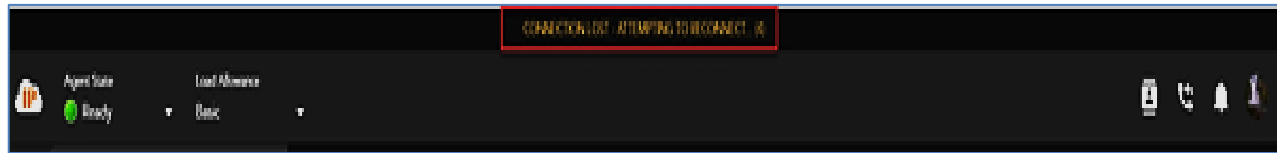
Once the interaction has ended, the Interaction Window will default to the Agent Actions screen. If a Disposition Code is mandatory, that must be selected first before the Agent can finish the interaction. To finish the interaction, select Complete in the Interaction Window. This will close the Interaction Window and return the Agent to a Ready state.



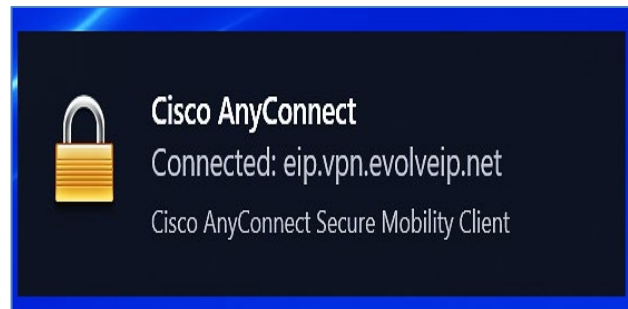
Why did I receive a message that states "Connection Lost. Attempting to Reconnect"

This message indicates that the Agent application detected that the browser is no longer connected to the Internet. The application is attempting to reconnect to the Internet to

restore functionality. Once the Internet connection is restored, the agent application will update to display the latest information.



We recommend turning on Web and OS notifications as well. This will help in notifying you that your connection was lost if you have navigated away from the web agent browser tab. See below for instructions on how to turn these notifications on. If turned on and you lose connection, you will receive the following two notifications when disconnected and reconnected:



What happens when an Agent "answers" a call by selecting the "Accept" button that appears when a call is being offered to them

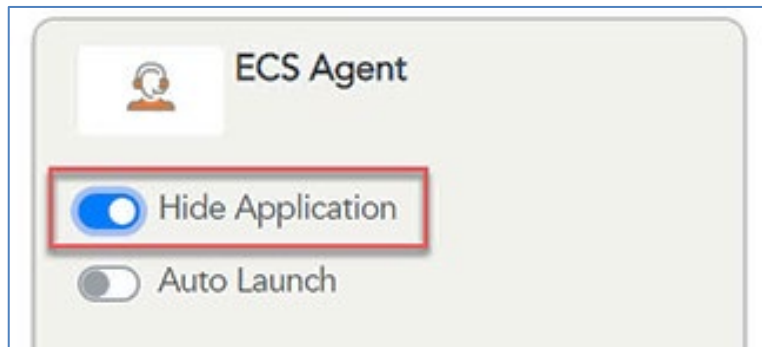
Every HPBX user is configured with a primary device (or end point) that is the default for handling calls. When a call is "Accepted" via the Agent application, the system attempts to answer that call on the user's primary device. Some Agents are configured with multiple devices such as a Handset in the office and UC-One while working from home. If that Agent is working from home (via UC-One) and their primary device is the handset in the office, hitting "Accept" will answer that call on the handset in the office. It is important to ensure that the primary device is properly configured for each Agent by working with Evolve IP's Support team.

Can I still access the regular version of the Agent application after I'm given access to the new browser version of the application

YES both versions of the Agent application are available for use. However, each Agent can only be signed into one version of the application at a time. For example, if an Agent launches the web version of the application while currently signed into the regular Windows version of the application, they will be automatically logged out of the first session.

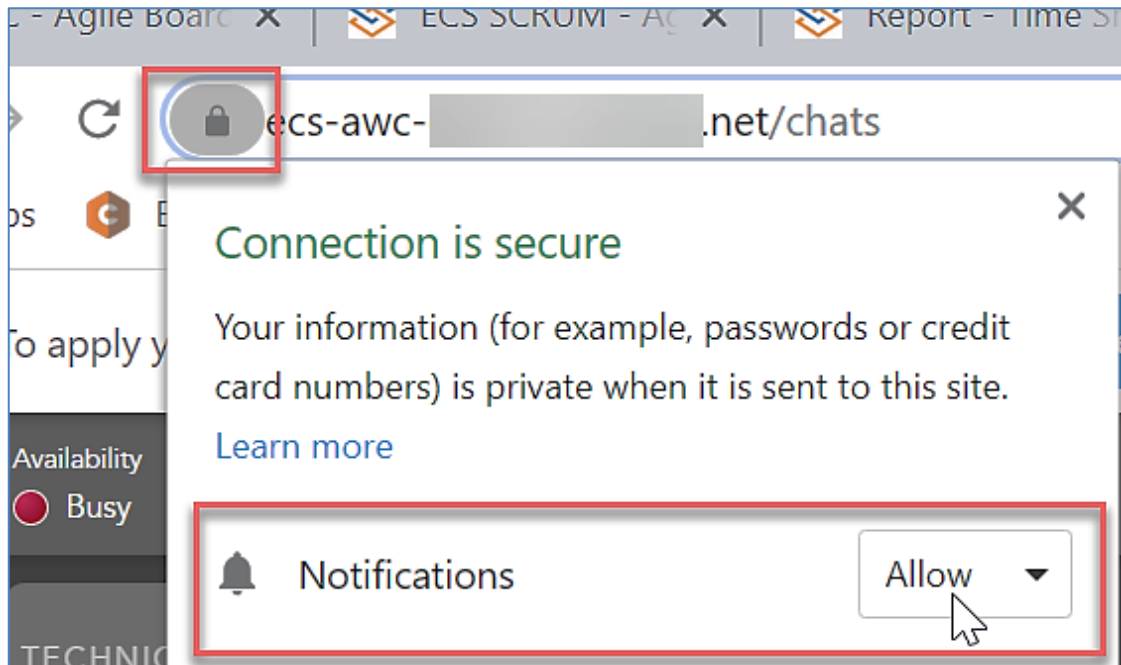
Why do some users see the ECS Agent tile in Clearlogin even though they are not part of the contact center

When the ECS Agent tile is made available, it becomes visible to all members of that organization. However, users outside of the contact center will not be able to login to the Agent application even though they see the tile. In order to open the application, each user must pass a one-time authentication challenge where valid Agent credentials must be entered. Any user that does not need to access the Agent application can hide the tile by selecting 'Hide Application' from the App Manager screen (accessed by selecting the wrench icon).



I enabled Notifications and they are no longer appearing, how do I restore them

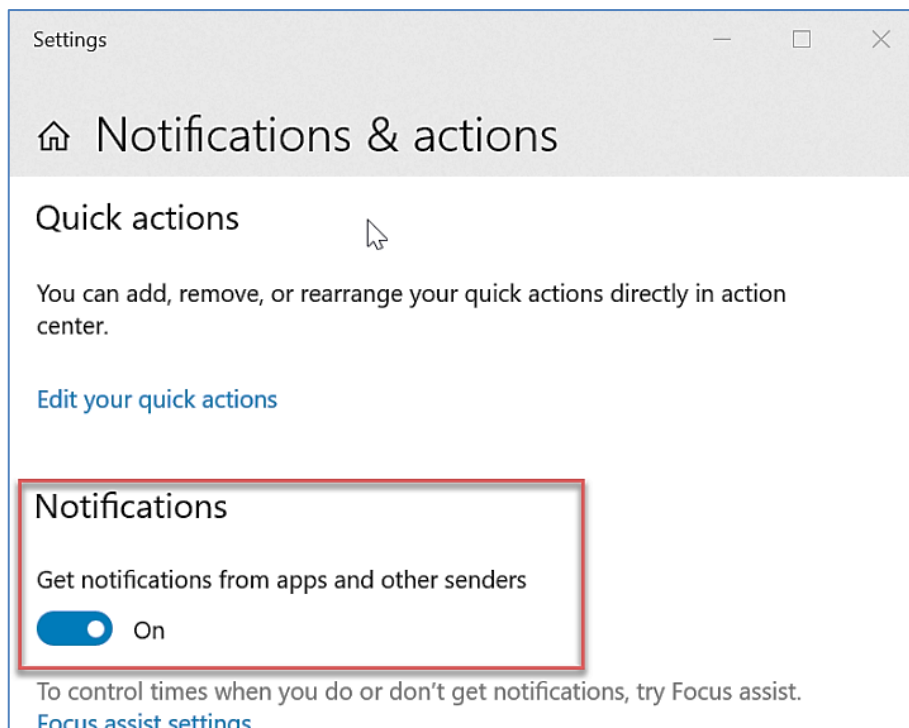
The Notifications can be blocked via the Browser or the underlying operating system (MacOS, Windows, etc.). It is recommended to enable Notifications because they will alert an Agent to an incoming interaction or other important action when they have navigated away from the browser tab. The Notification settings vary by browser and operating system so please consult online help or an Internet search for the exact steps. To restore notifications blocked by the Chrome browser, navigate to Settings > Privacy and Security > Site Settings > Notifications, select the Agent URL (ecs-web.evolveip.net), and select Allow from the options. In Chrome, within the URL if the follow icon is available, you can click on the icon to show whether you have the notifications blocked or allowed. Simply select from the drop down to allow notifications.

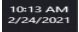


You will also need to make sure that you have your OS notifications enabled

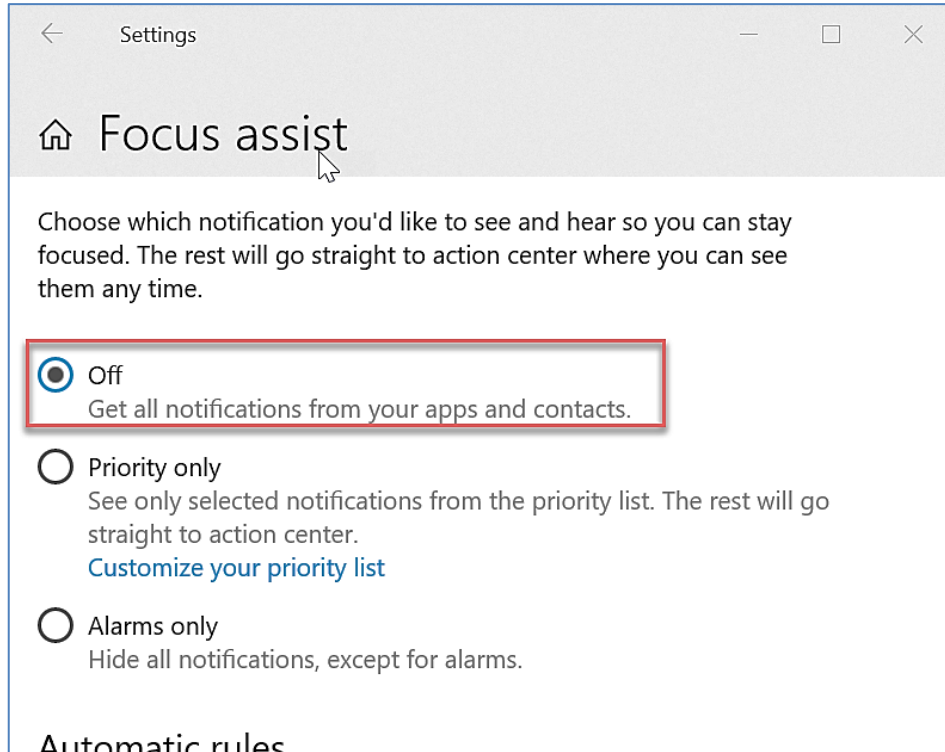


To turn on these notifications, click on the notifications icon > Manage Notifications > Notifications and turn on the notifications.

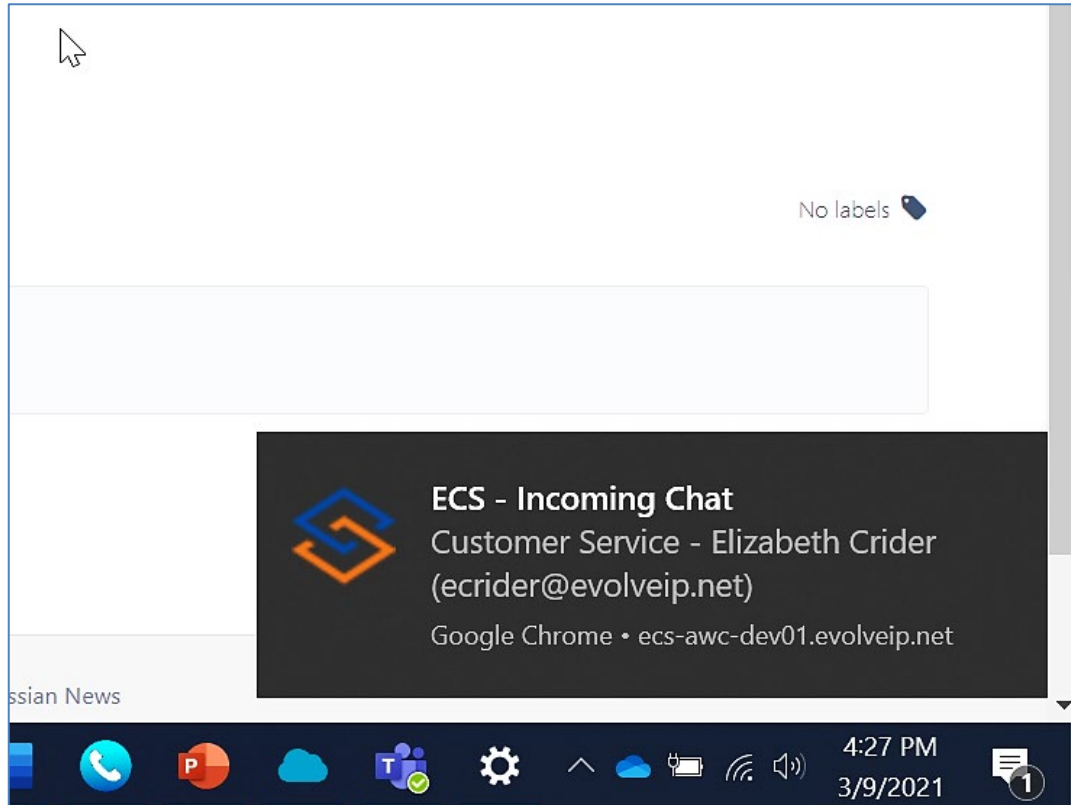


If these have been enabled, but you are still not seeing notifications, you may have Focus Assist on, suppressing the notifications, indicated by the following icon  within the OS notifications icon.

To manage and turn the focus assist off, click on Focus Assist Settings and turn focus assist off.



Once everything has been enabled correctly, when you navigate away from the Web Agent Browser tab and receive an incoming interaction, you will get the following notification.



Are there currently any Known Limitations

Known Limitations

4-way Conference Calling	Cannot initiate a 4-way Conference call. If needed, the agent can sign into the .Net client and perform a 4-way conference call. This is a future feature enhancement for the Web Agent.
Outbound Campaign Calls (Dialer)	Current limitations on answering Campaign calls in the Web Agent for full feature functionality.
DTMF	Agent cannot perform a DTMF action through the Web Agent. They can perform DTMF on their UC One, Teams or Handset. This is future feature enhancement for the Web Agent.
WAV File	Agents cannot play a WAV file to an active caller.

Internal Softphone	The application does not support the Internal Phone (integrated softphone) - all calls must be delivered to a separate endpoint (e.g. handset, mobile phone, UC-One, Teams etc.).
Answer on UC One	Can only answer on a primary device. Shared Call Appearance phones, UC One and Teams need to be answered directly on the device.
Auto Screen Pop	The agent must click on the links found in the active interaction window to launch a URL.
Clipboard Integration	Agents must manually enter in or copy and paste a number to place an outgoing call.

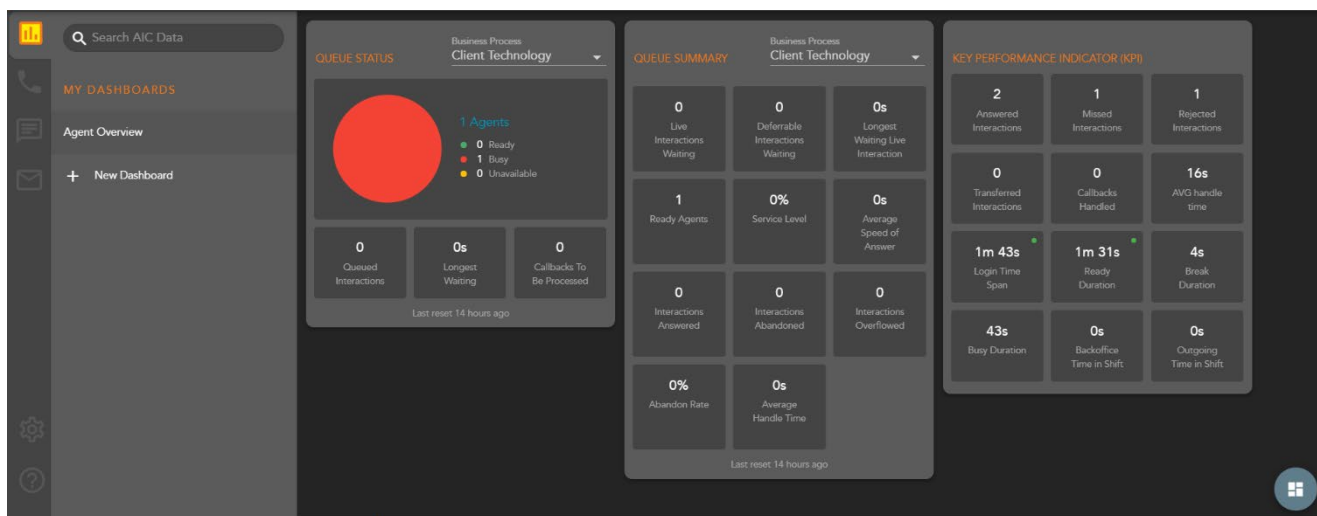

Agent Intelligence Center

Overview

The Agent Intelligence Center is the default view when the agent first logs in. The initial dashboard, Agent Overview, provides the agents with real time statistics on how the contact center is performing and agent statistics, specific to the logged in agent. On initial login the agent application will create a default dashboard view: Agent Overview. This view will consist of one Queue Status, Queue Summary, and Key Performance Indicator (KPI) card. Each queue card will initially default to the first alphabetical Business Process an agent is assigned.

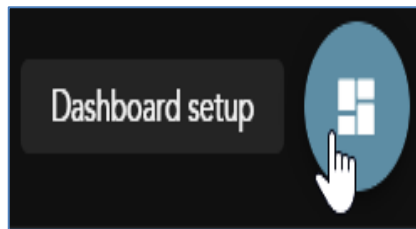
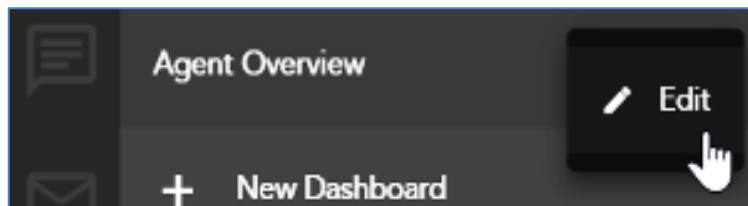
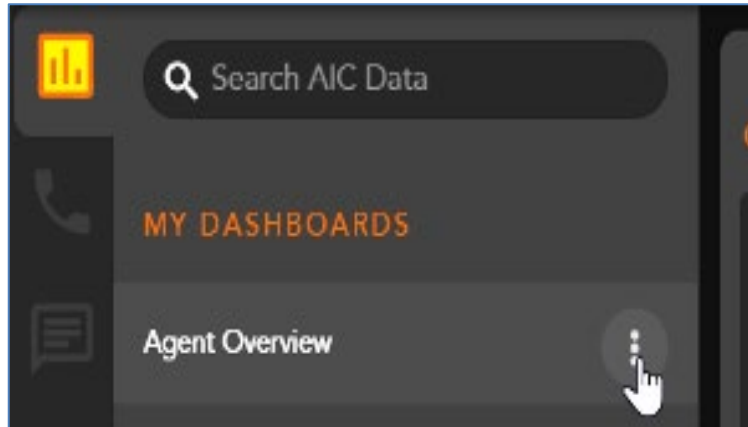


1. **Queue Status** - provides real time stats on the selected Business Process including:
 - a. Agents in a Ready, Busy or Unavailable state
 - b. Queued Interactions - total number of queued interactions waiting to be handled by an agent
 - c. Longest Waiting (interactions) - the amount of time the longest waiting interaction has been waiting in Queue
 - d. Callbacks To Be Processed - number of callbacks waiting to be processed
2. **Queue Summary**- provides real time and summary stats on the selected Business Process including:
 - a. Live Interactions Waiting - total number of interactions waiting in queue to be handled by an agent
 - b. Deferrable Interactions Waiting - total number of deferrable interactions waiting in queue to be handled by an agent
 - c. Longest Waiting Live Interaction - the amount of time the longest waiting interaction has been waiting in Queue

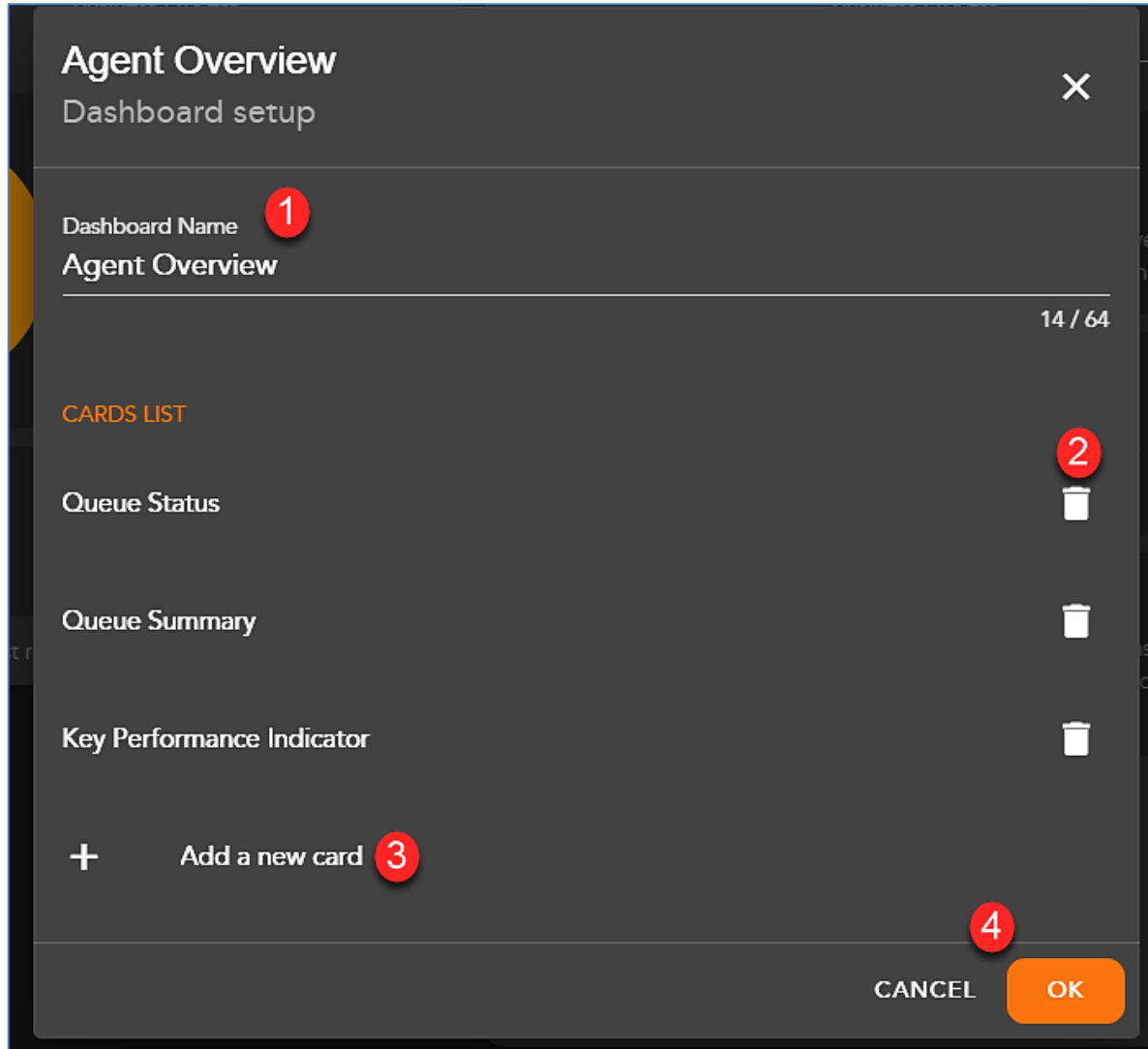
- d. Ready Agents - total number of Ready agents within the Business Process
 - e. Service Level % - the percentage of inbound interactions that entered the queue and an agent responded within the specified time goal
 - f. Average Speed of Answer - average amount of time that a contact waited before an agent answered the interaction
 - g. Interactions Answered - total number of answered interactions
 - h. Interactions Abandoned - any interaction that entered the queue and was abandoned by the contact before reaching an agent
 - i. Interactions Overflowed - total number of overflowed interactions
 - j. Abandon Rate % - the number of abandons / number of queued interactions
 - k. Average Handle Time - Calculated as sum of talk + hold + wrap / the count of queued calls that were answered
3. **Key Performance Indicator (KPI)** - provides real time and summary stats on the agent's performance including:
- a. Answered Interactions - total number of interactions answered by the agent
 - b. Missed Interactions - total number of interactions missed by the agent
 - c. Rejected Interactions - total number of interactions rejected by the agent
 - d. Transferred Interactions - total number of interactions transferred by the agents
 - e. Callbacks Handled - total number of callbacks handled by the agent
 - f. Average Handle Time - agents sum of talk + hold + wrap up / the count of queued interactions the agent answered
 - g. Login Time Duration - total amount of time the agent as been logged in
 - h. Ready Duration - total amount of time spent in a Ready state
 - i. Break Duration - total amount of time spent in a Break state
 - j. Busy Duration - total amount of time spent in a Busy state
 - k. Backoffice Time Duration - total amount of time spent in the Backoffice state
 - l. Outgoing Time Duration - total amount of time spent in the Outgoing state

Editing the Agent Overview

To edit the Agent Overview, select menu options and Edit in the AIC Dashboard Panel or select the Dashboard setup floating action button.



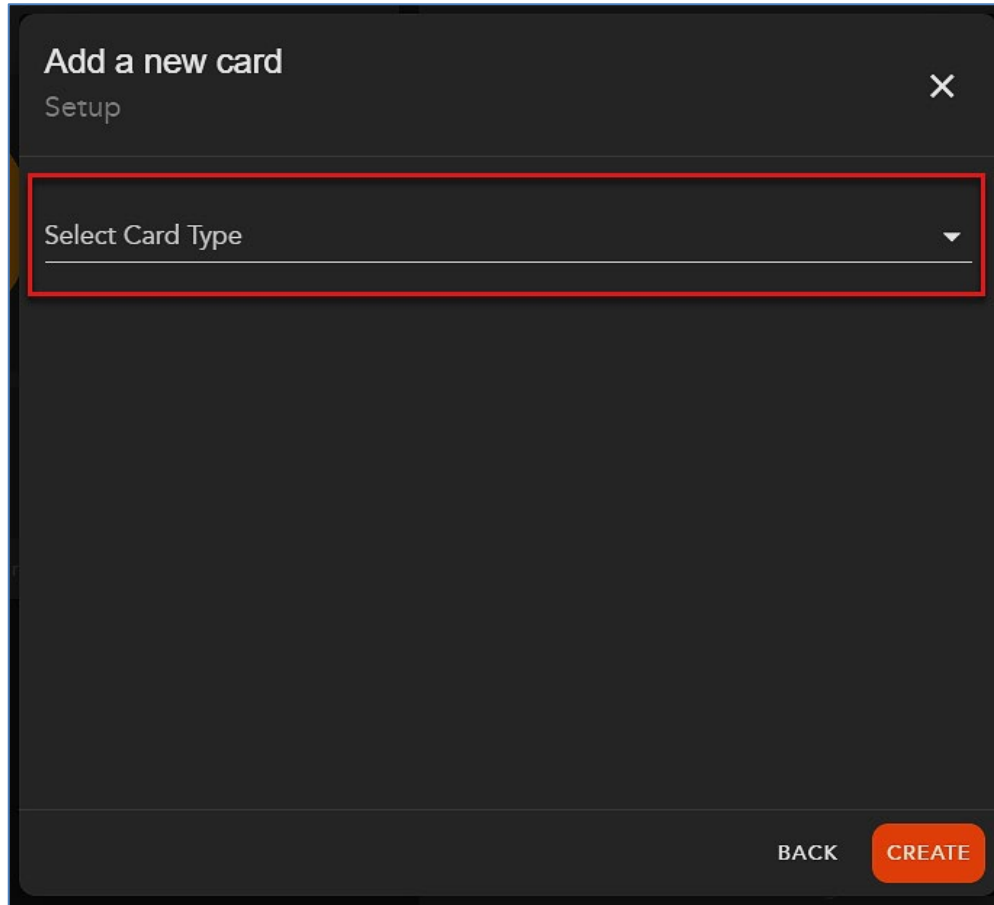
The edit Dashboard window will open with the following options:



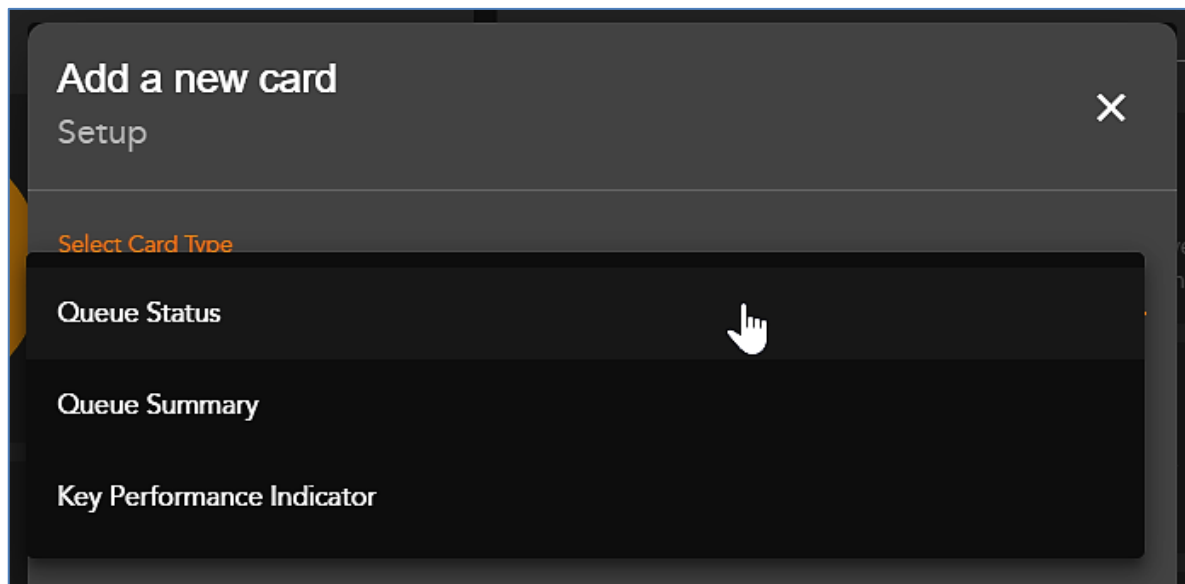
1. **Edit or Rename the Dashboard** - provides the ability to change the current dashboard name
2. **Delete a Card** - this will remove a current card from the dashboard view
3. **Add a New Card** - add a new queue status or summary card
4. **Cancel or OK** - closes the window

Add a New Card

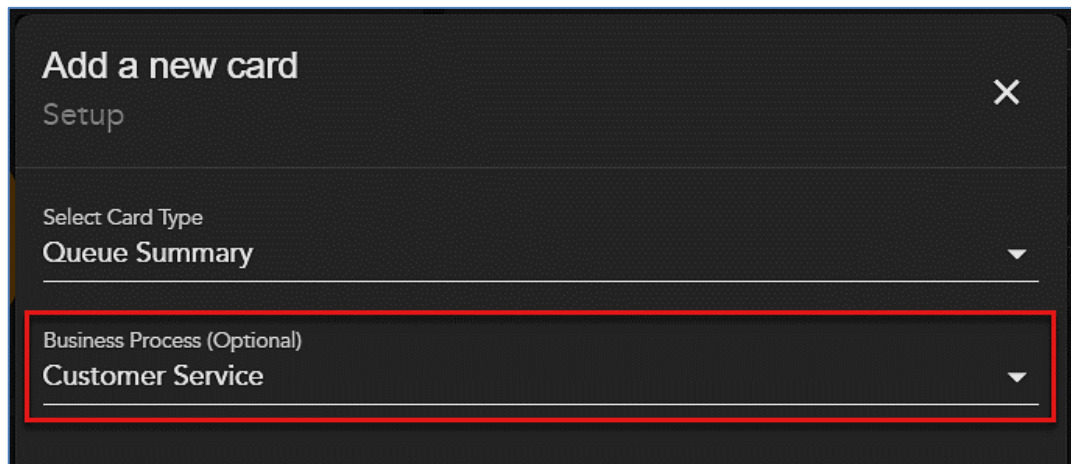
Within the edit dashboard window, you have the ability to **add a new card**. When selecting this option, the edit Dashboard window will update to allow for adding a new card.



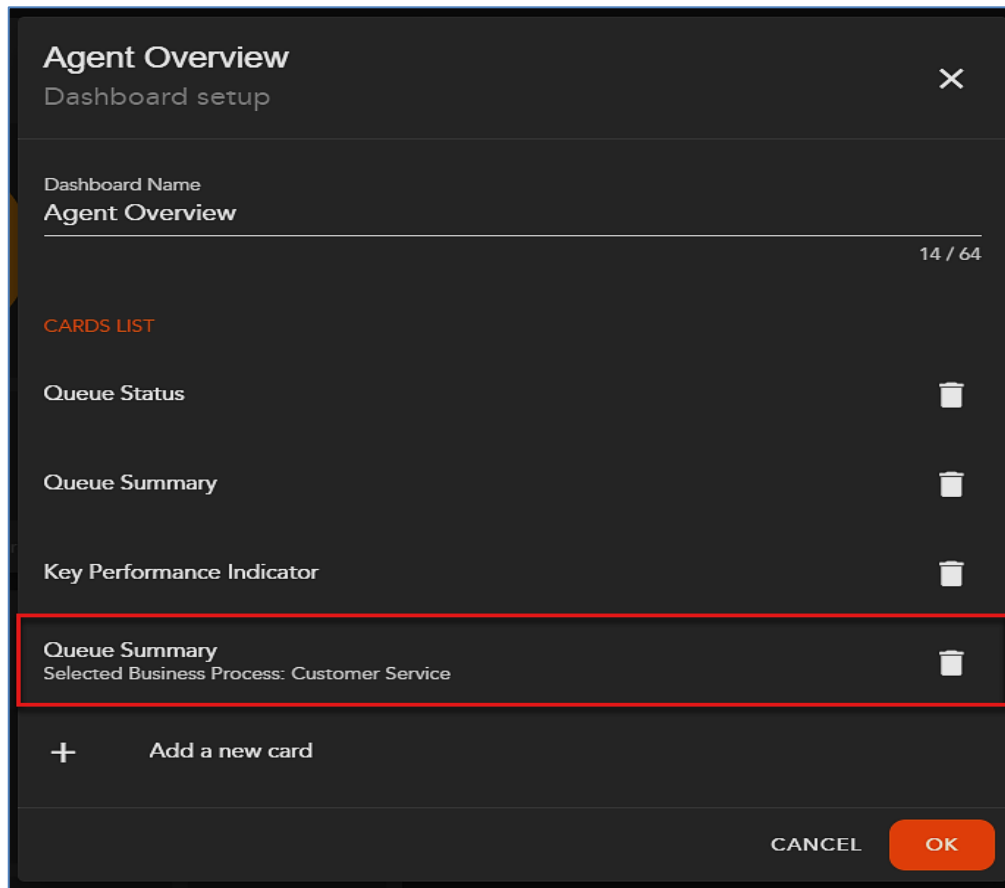
From the *Select Card Type* drop down select to add a Queue Summary, Queue Status Card or Key Performance Indicator (KPI) Card.



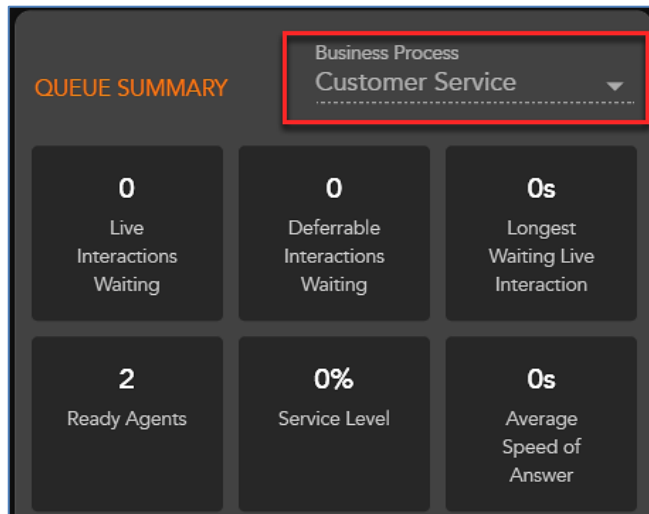
When selecting to add a Queue Summary or Queue Status card, you have the option to select which Business Process stats to show within the new card.



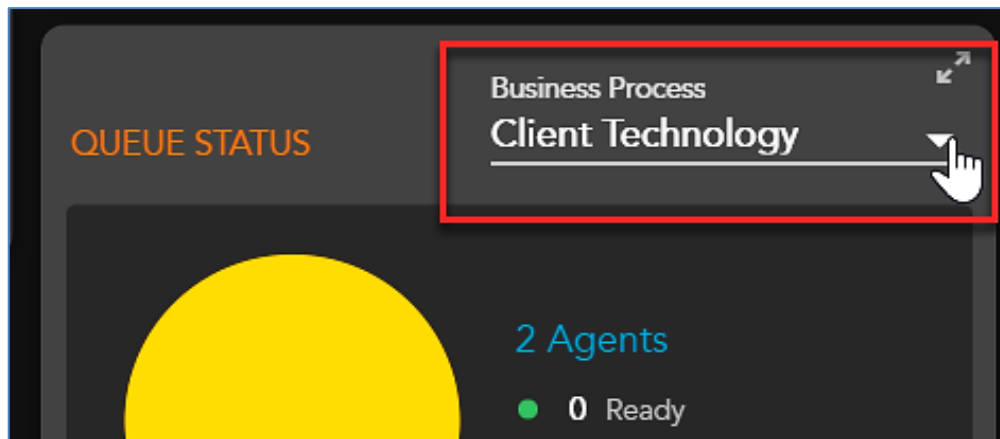
Select [**Create**] to add the card to your Dashboard view. Once created the Dashboard edit window will update to show your newly created card. The new card will show the selected Business Process if added on card creation.



Note: When a card is created to show a specific Business Process, you will be unable to adjust the Business Process chosen in the main Dashboard view. The Business Process drop down will be grayed out.

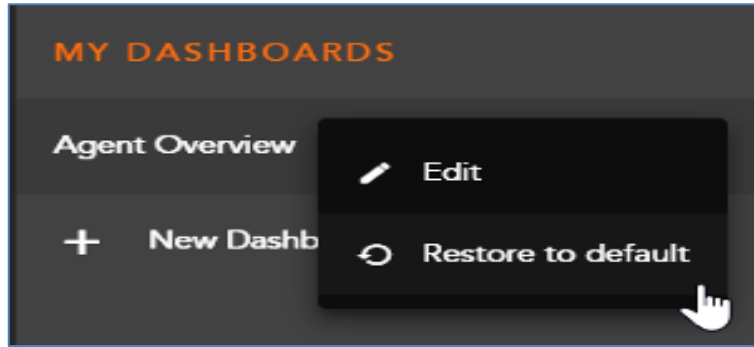


If a new card is added with no Business Process selected on creation, the Business Process drop down will not be grayed out, allowing you to switch between which Business Process to show in the main Dashboard view.



Restore to Default

After making changes to the default *Agent Overview* Dashboard view, you can choose to restore the view to its original format. The original format would include its original title (*Agent Overview*) and just one Queue Status, Queue Summary and Key Performance Indicator (KPI) card. To restore to the default view, select menu options in the dashboard panel next to the dashboard and select *Restore to Default*.



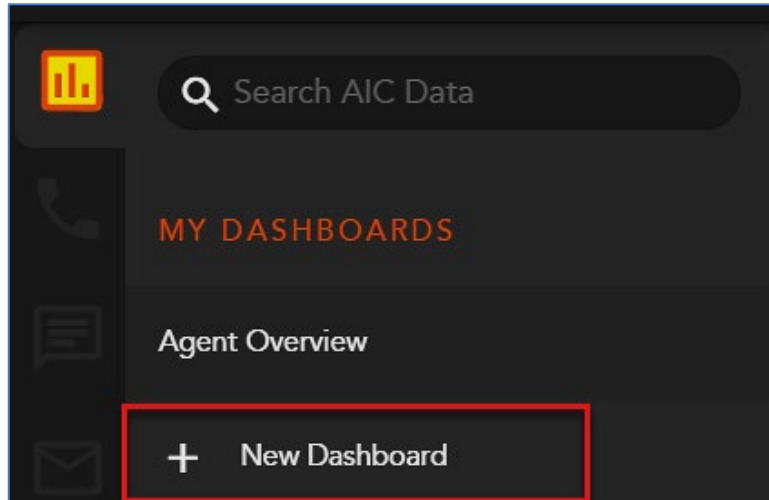
The Restore to Default will only be available if you only have one dashboard created in the AIC Panel.

Add a New Dashboard

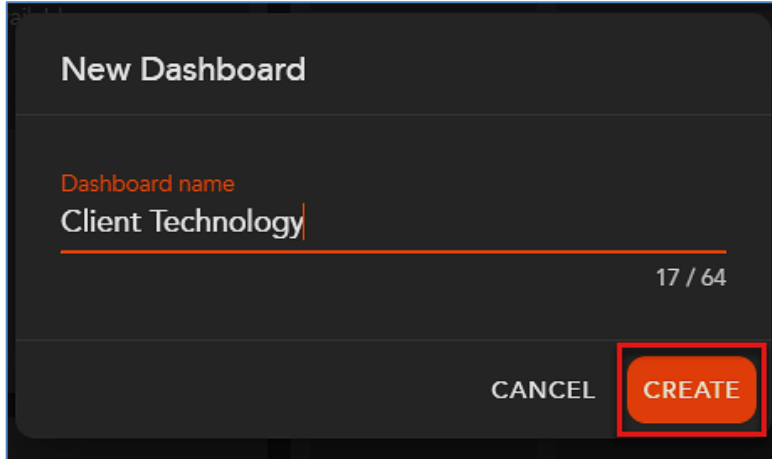
Adding a New Dashboard

The AIC allows for agents to have multiple Dashboards. This provides agents the ability to customize different dashboard views and the cards within those views. Agents can have multiple dashboards and easily navigate between the views.

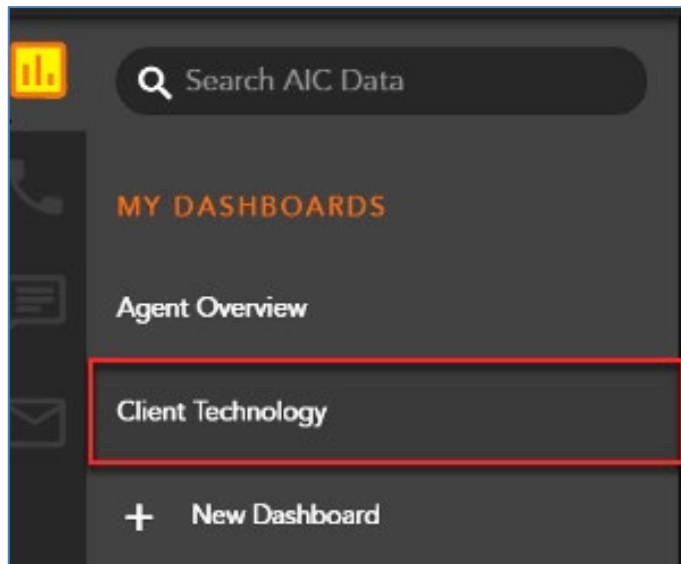
To add a new dashboard, select *New Dashboard* within the AIC Panel.



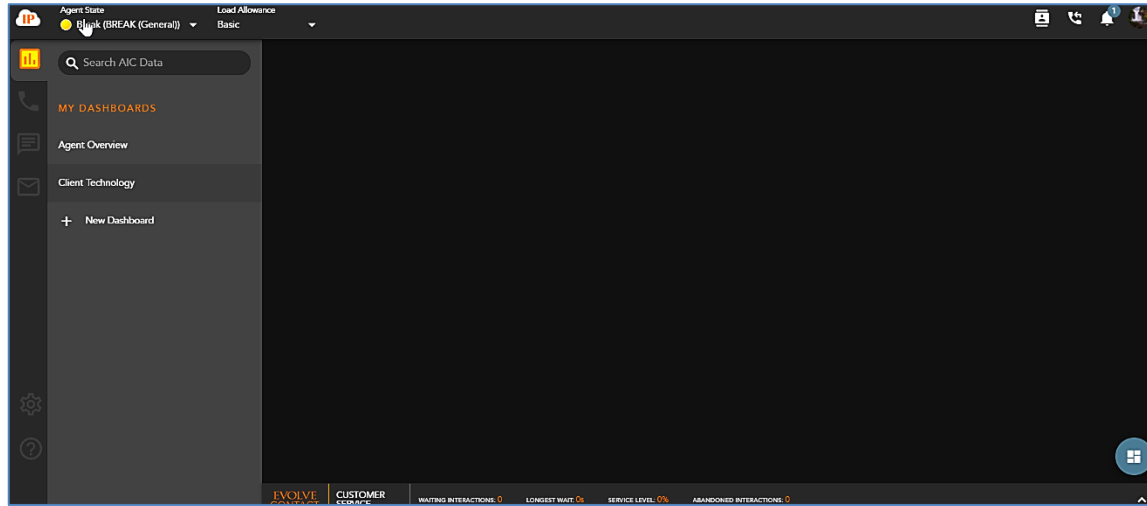
A New Dashboard window will open. Enter the name of the new Dashboard; select *Create*.



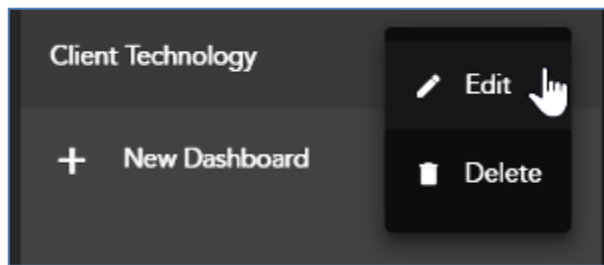
Once created, the new Dashboard will appear in the AIC Panel.



When you click on the dashboard, the dashboard view will be blank.

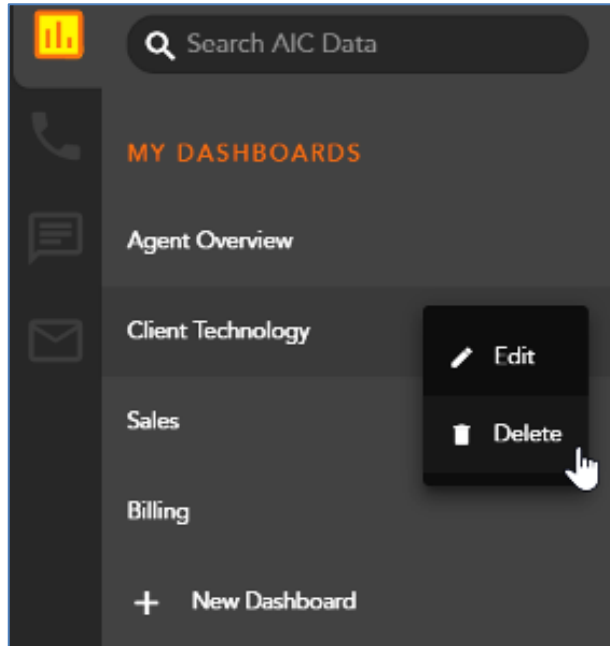

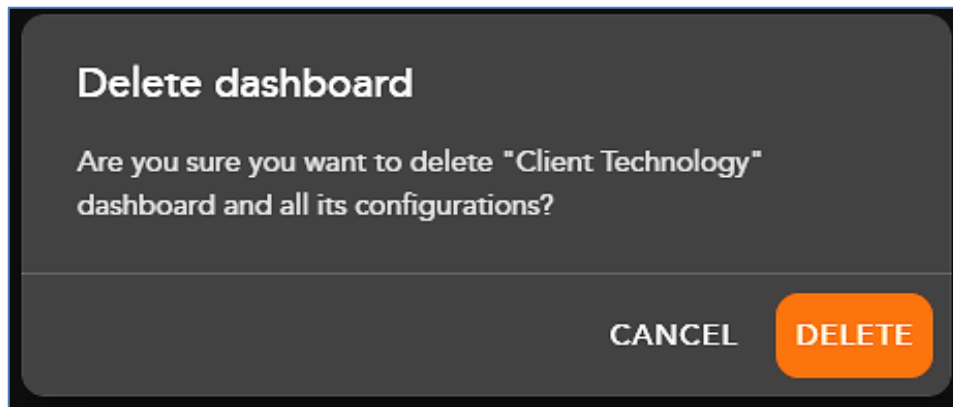


Deleting a Dashboard

A Dashboard can be deleted if there are more than one Dashboard views in the AIC Panel. To delete a Dashboard view, select menu options > **Delete**

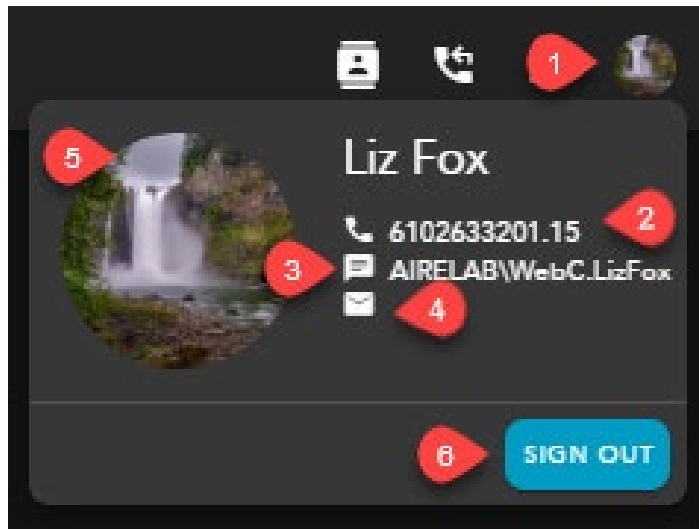


A confirmation pop up will ask you to confirm you want to delete the dashboard. Select *Cancel* to cancel the deletion of the dashboard or *Delete* to confirm you wish to delete the dashboard.



Agent Profile

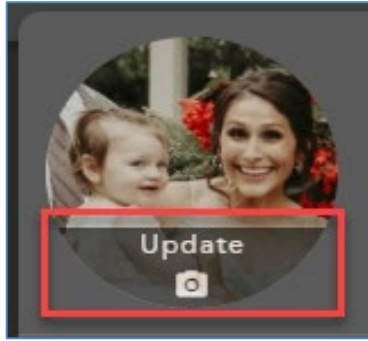

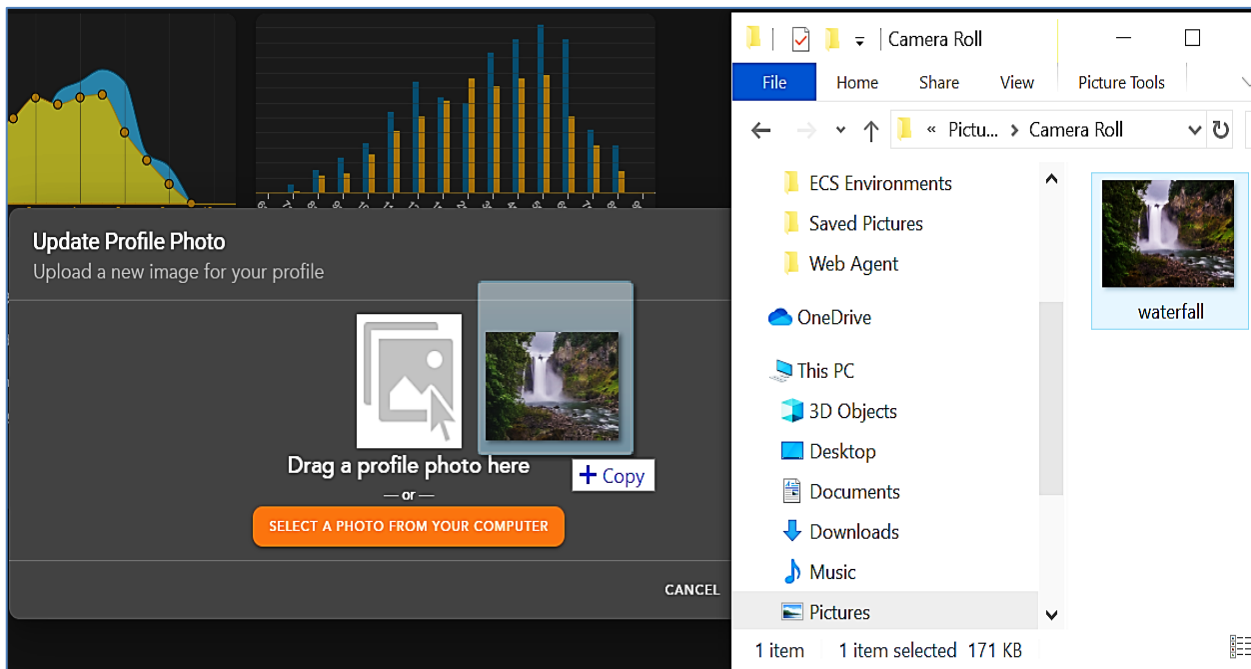
1. Agent Profile Icon - access to agent information, avatar upload and Sign Out
2. Agent End Point - agents end point - HPBX Phone or Private Phone. HPBX phone would be a physical handset or soft phone client like UC One. Private Phone would indicate that you are currently forwarding all numbers to a private phone, i.e cellphone
3. Agent Username
4. Email - agent email address if added to the Setup client
5. Agent Avatar - provides the ability to upload a unique image or logo for the agent's avatar. If no image is uploaded it will display the agents initials or name
 - a. Supported image file types - *.jpg *.gif *.bmp *.png *.svg.
 - b. Supported file size - up to 1024 Kb
6. Sign Out - sign out of the application

Adding an Agent Avatar

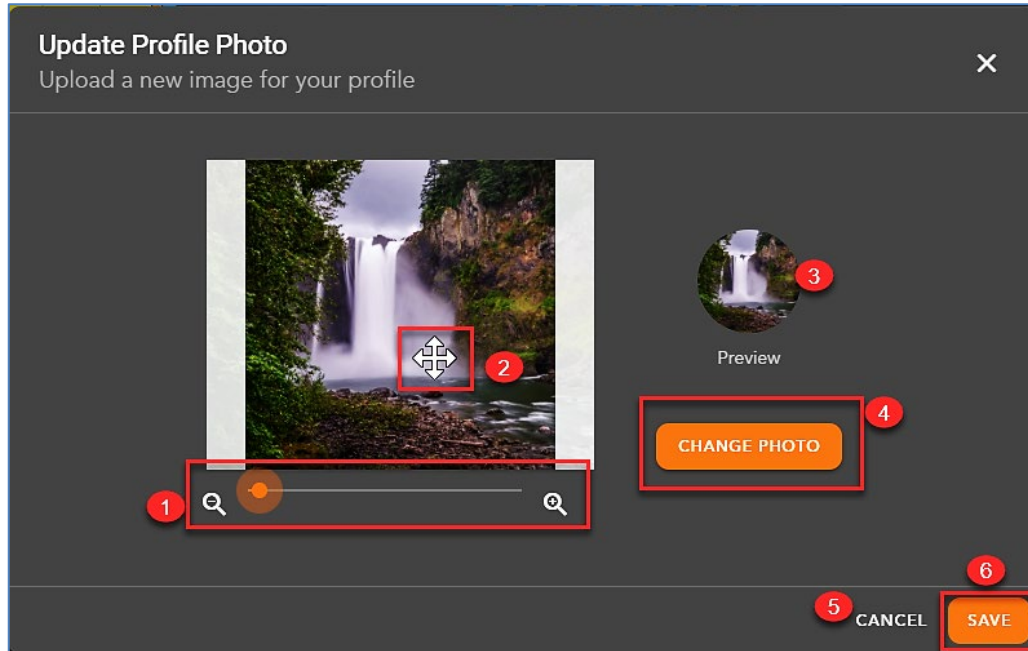
Hover our the agent avatar and select update,



The Update Profile Picture window will open. You can drag a photo into the window, or search to add a picture from your computer.

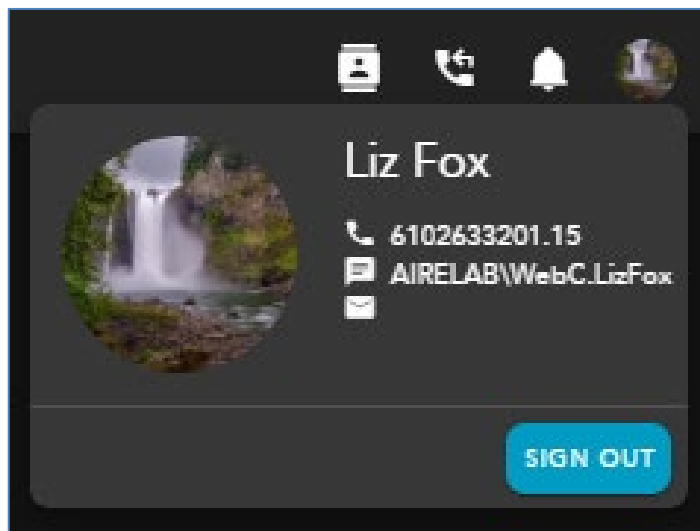


Once a photo has been selected, you can update your photo.



1. Minimize or maximize the photo
2. Drag the photo for desired placement
3. Preview of agent avatar and profile picture
4. Change the photo to a different photo
5. Cancel changes to keep current avatar photo
6. Save changes to update avatar photo

Saved changes will update Agent Profile picture and Avatar.

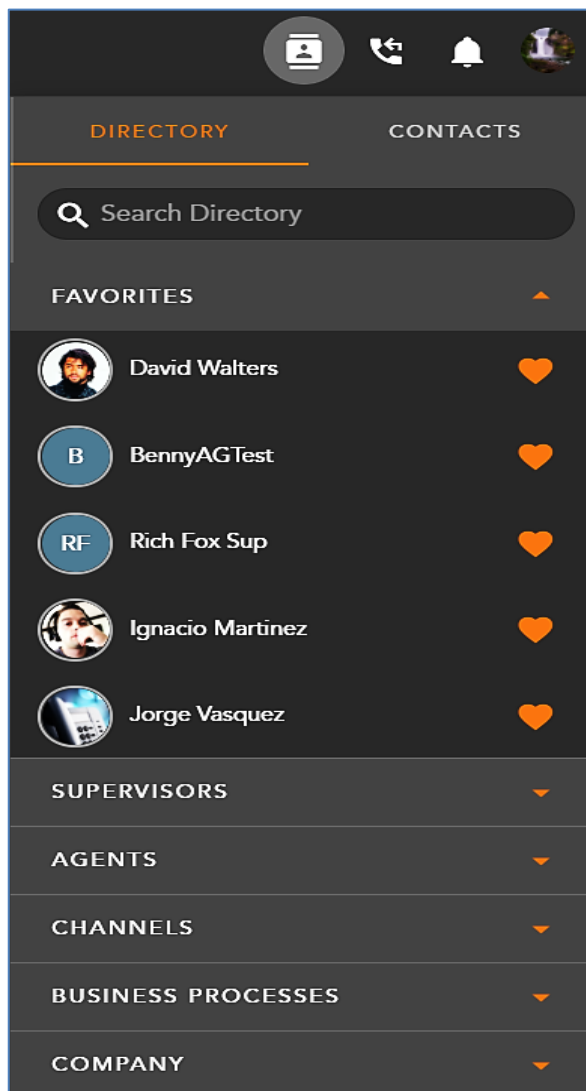


Contacts

Using Contacts

The Contacts tab consists of your organization’s contact center contacts including Agents, Supervisors, Business Processes and Channels, as well as non contact center contacts including the Company directory, CRM Contacts and External Address Book. Setup a favorites list to easily access contacts you communicate with on a regular basis to help initiate quick interactions with your contacts and organizations end users.

1. **Directory** - consists of your directory Favorites, Agents, Channels, Business Processes and Company Directory
2. **Contacts** - consists of your External Favorites Contact List, CRM Contacts and External Address Book

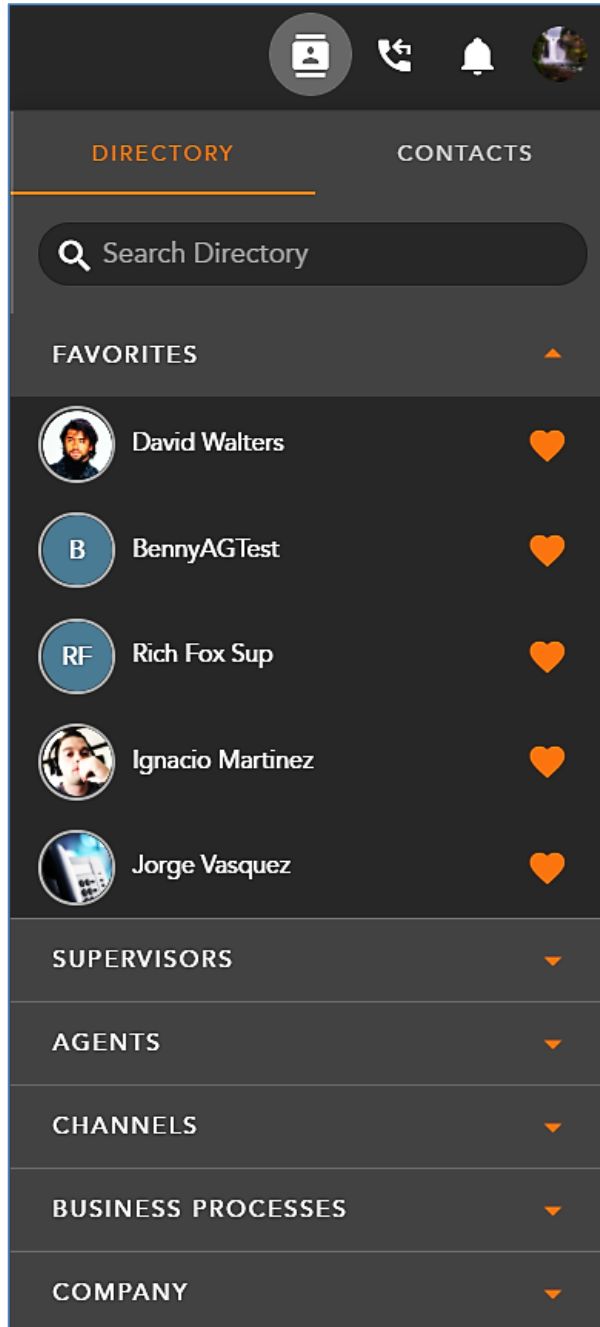


Directory Tab

Upon first signing in and accessing the contacts tab, your default view will open to your Directory favorites.

The Directory Tab consists of the following:

1. **Favorites** - contacts added from the Supervisor, Agent, Channel, Business Process and Company directories. You can have up to a total of 30 favorites within the Directory view. Your favorites list will be available when performing transfers or conferencing on queued interaction.
2. **Supervisors** - All Supervisors within the Contact Center. Supervisors that have been added as a favorite will appear at the top of the list, followed by the rest of the Supervisors in alphabetical order.
3. **Agents** - All Agents within the Contact Center. Agents that have been added as a favorite will appear at the top of the list, followed by the rest of the Agents in alphabetical order.
4. **Channels** - All Channels within the Contact Center. Channels that have been added as a favorite will appear at the top of the list, followed by the rest of the Channels in alphabetical order.
5. **Business Processes** - All Business Processes within the Contact Center. Business Processes that have been added as a favorite will appear at the top of the list, followed by the rest of the Business Processes in alphabetical order.
6. **Company** - All end users (including agents and supervisors), Hunt Groups, and Auto Attendants within the Company. This directory will comprise of end users HPBX ten digits DID or extension. This will also provide the end users availability by displaying the on hook/off hook state.



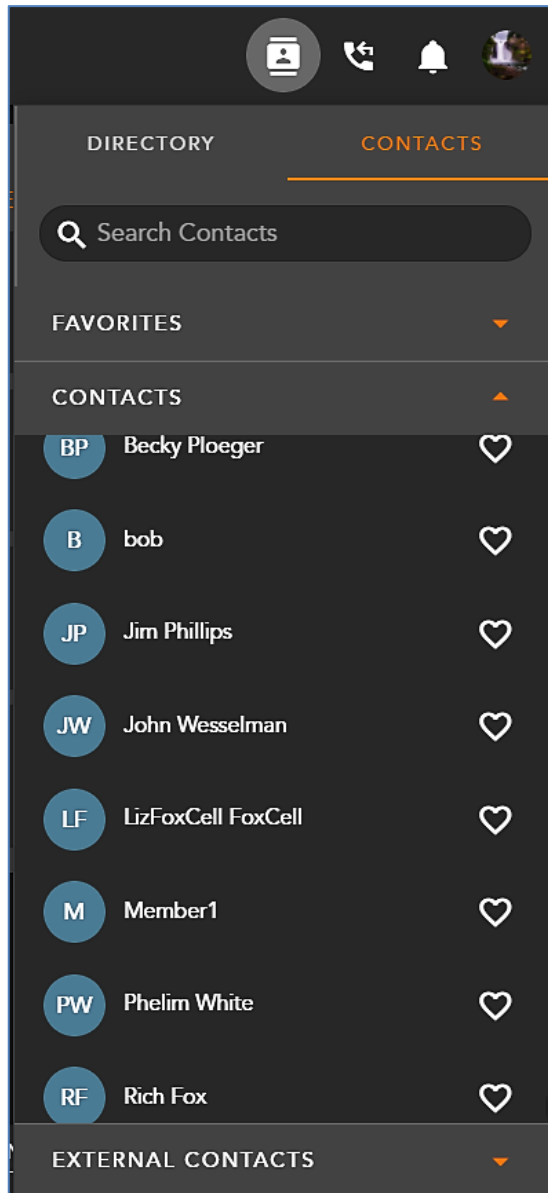
Contacts Tab

The Contacts Tab consists of the following:

1. **Favorites** - contacts selected from the Contacts and External Address Book directories. You can have up to a total of 30 favorites within the Contacts view.
2. **Contacts** - contains the list of contacts that can be found within the Contact Management system. These contacts are typically added by the Supervisor or System

Administrator through the Supervisor Client. Contacts that have been added as a favorite will appear at the top of the list contact list, followed by the rest of the contacts in alphabetical order,

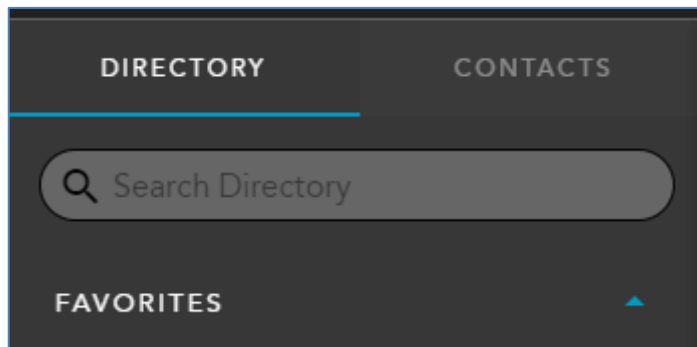
3. **External Contacts** - contains a list of contacts outside of the organization that is managed within the Setup Client. Contacts that have been added as a favorite will appear at the top of the list, followed by the rest of the contacts in alphabetical order.






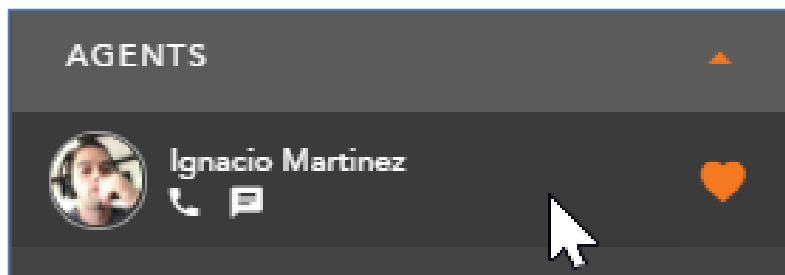
Searching for a Contact

You can search for a contact based on the following criteria: DID, HPBX Extension, Contact Center Extension, First and Last Name and Email Address.

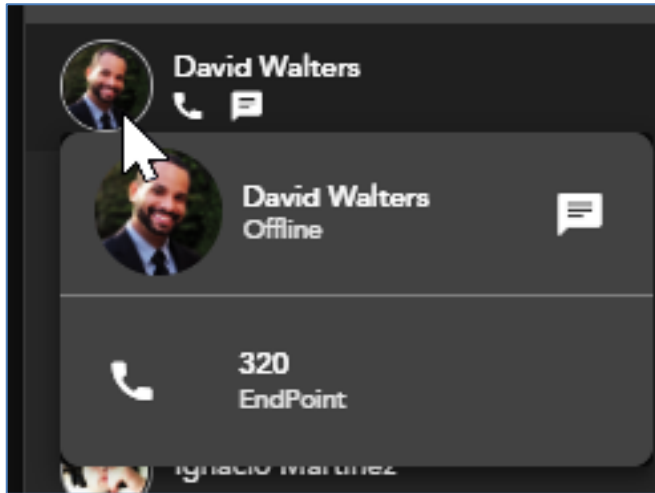
1. Enter in your search criteria within the Search Directory Bar. Search criteria include the contact's name, email, phone number or phone extension.



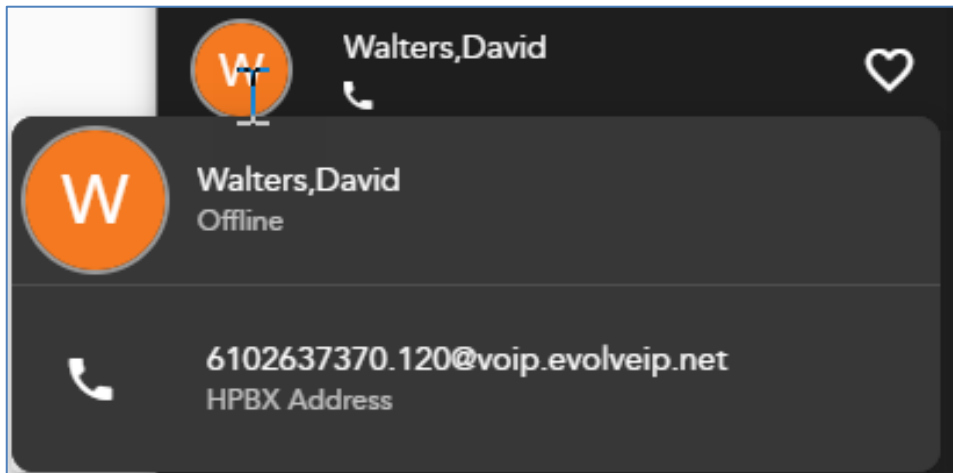
2. As you begin typing, the directory will filter out directory lists that do not match your search criteria.
3. When you've finished your search there are two ways you can initiate an interaction with a contact:
 - a. Hover directly over the contacts name to show which communication options are available. If searching for an Agent or Supervisor email may or may not be available depending on their profile settings within the Setup client. Clicking on one of the available icons  (Telephony),  (Chat), or  (Email) will initiate the interaction with the contact.



- b. Hover over the contacts image or avatar to get more detailed information about the contacts Extension/DID and email address. Initiate an interaction from by clicking on the appropriate icon.
- c. This first example shows the contact information of an Agent. The extension shown is specific to the contact center and can only be dialed between agents and supervisors.



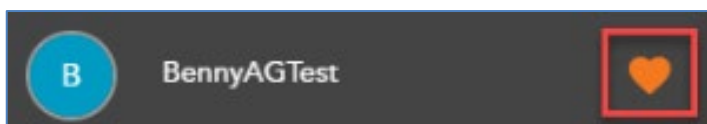
- d. This second example shows a contact from the Company directory and is specific to the end users HPBX extension. If no image was upload for the contact, the avatar will show the initials of the contact.



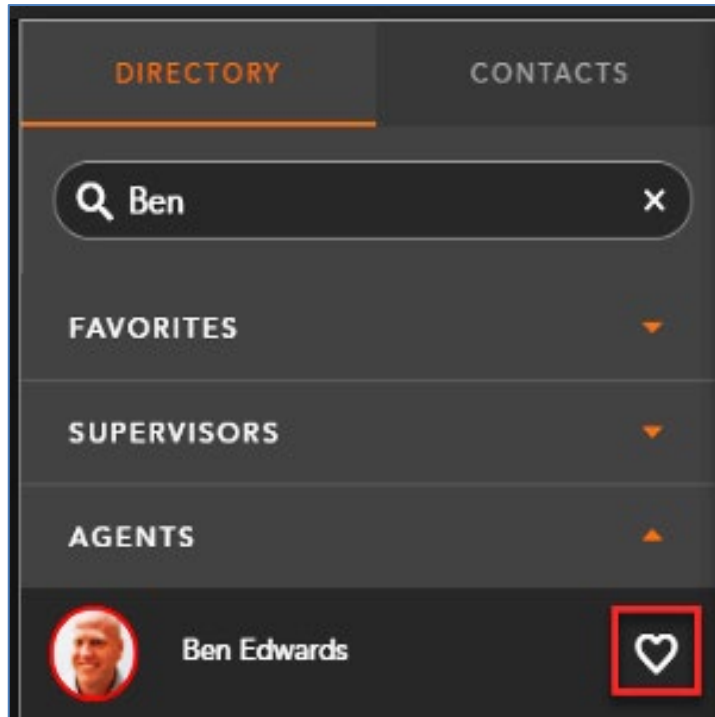
Adding and Removing a Favorite

Search for the user, Business Process, or Channel you wish to add to your favorites list. As you begin to enter your search criteria the Directory tab will filter down to populate only the contacts that match your search criteria.

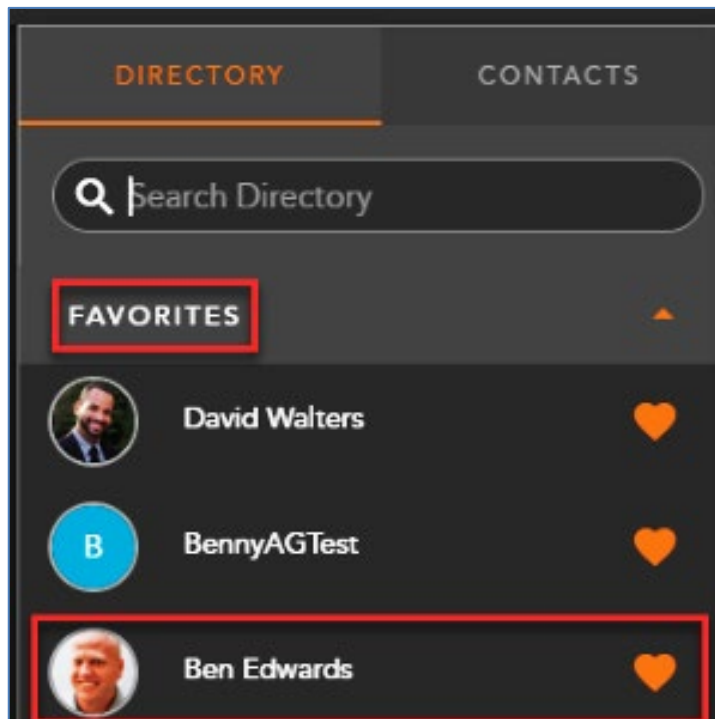
If you have already added the contact to your favorites, you will see the favorites icon highlighted next to their name.



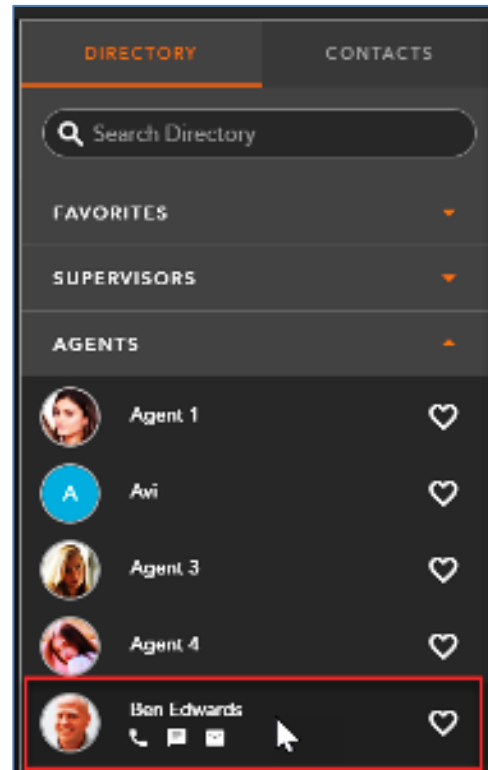
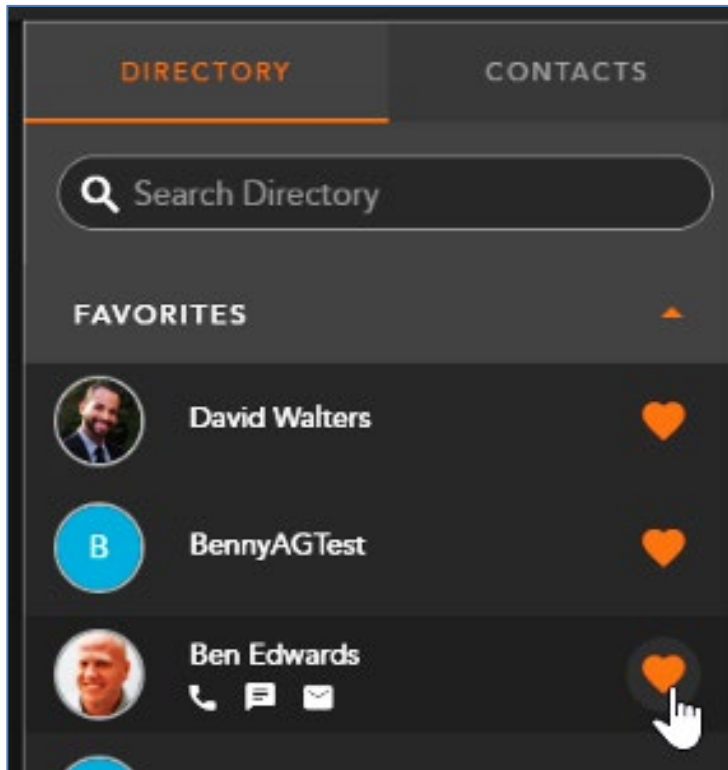
If the contact have not been added, the favorites icon will not appear highlighted.



Select the *Favorites* icon to add the user to your favorites list.



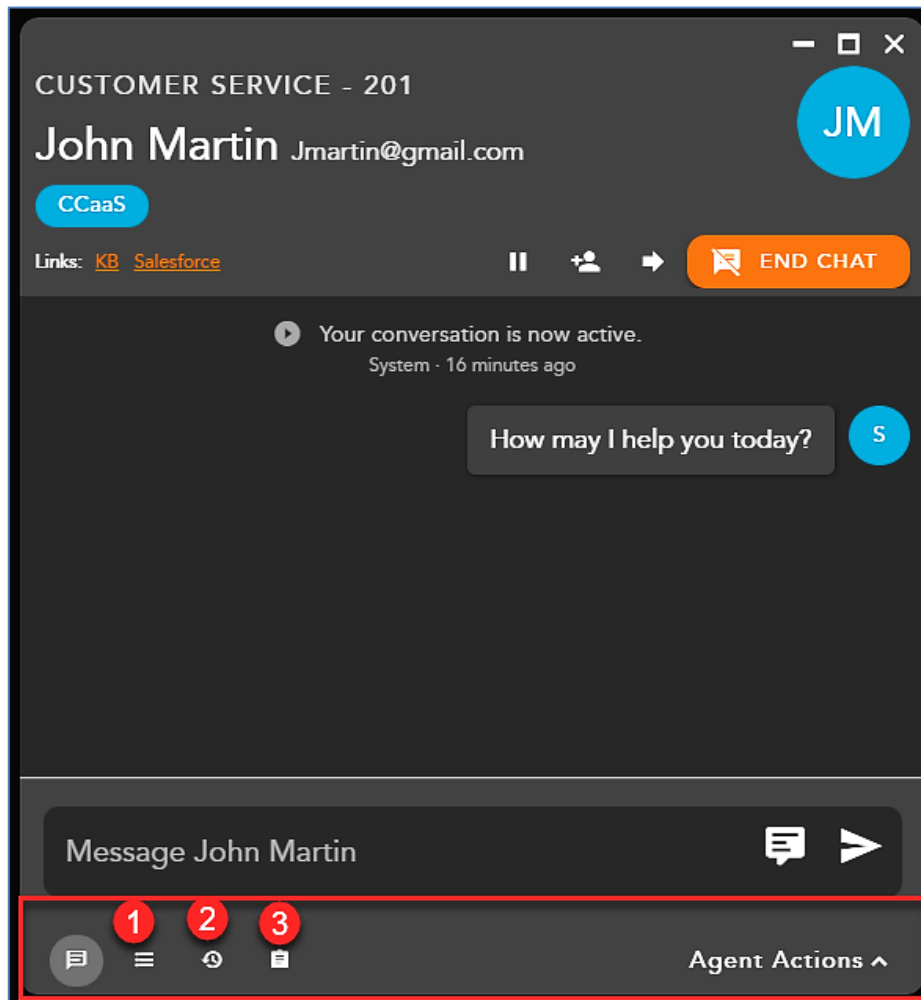
To remove a contact from your favorites, click on the highlighted icon next to the contact to remove them from the list.



CRM Panel

Overview

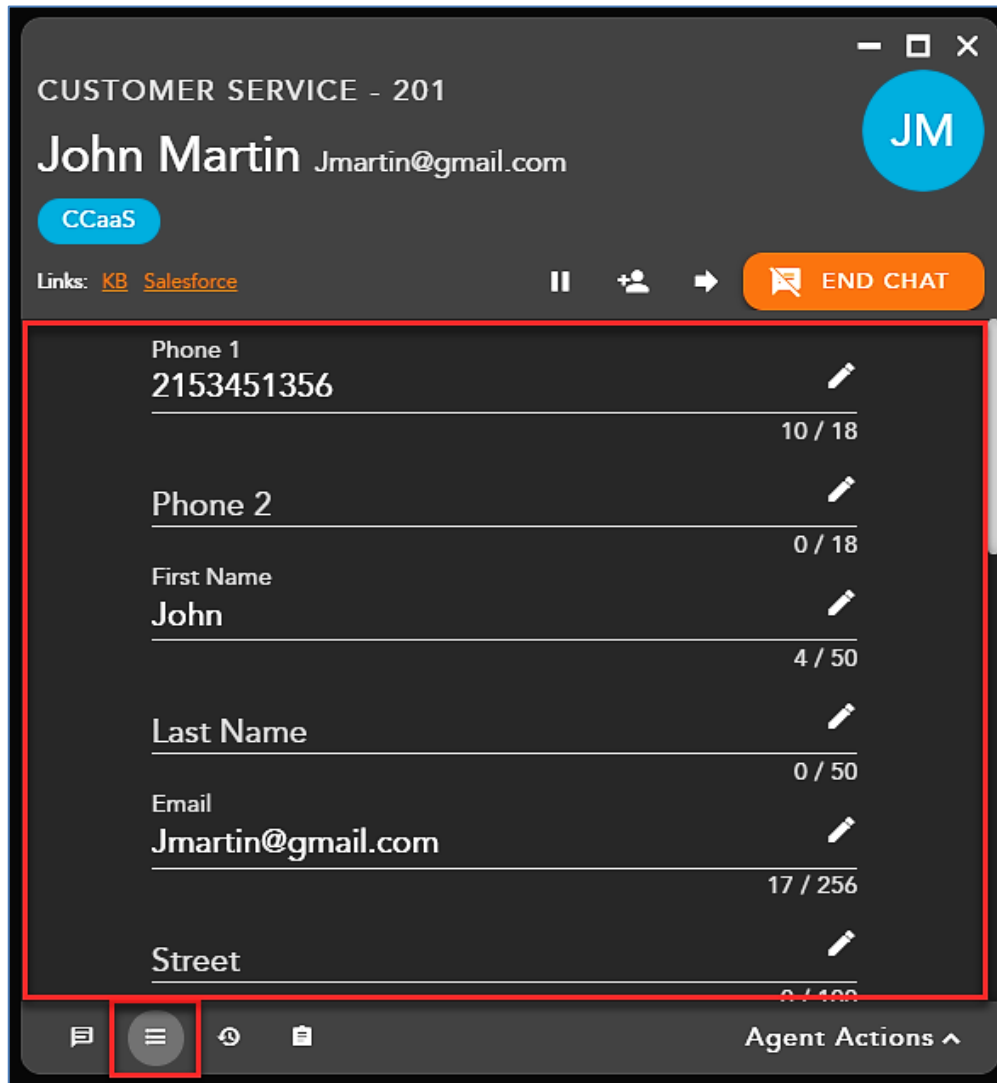
The CRM panel is available on active or historical interactions and provides agents access to the contacts information, historical interactions and notes and remarks from past interactions. The CRM panel is only available to agents when enabled on the agents profile found in the Setup Client.



CRM options are available in the Interactions Footer

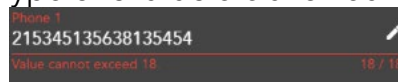
1. **Contacts** - displays the saved contact information. The available fields are pre-configured through a CRM template in the Setup Client.
2. **History** - displays the contacts historical interactions
3. **Notes and Remarks** - notes and remarks made by agents or through the Interaction Handling Flow about the contact

Contacts



Contacts will display all available contact information. The fields that are viewable and editable to an agent are determined by an Administrator in the Setup Client. Each field has validation on the limit and type of characters allowed. A *validation error* will be shown

if the character limit is reached

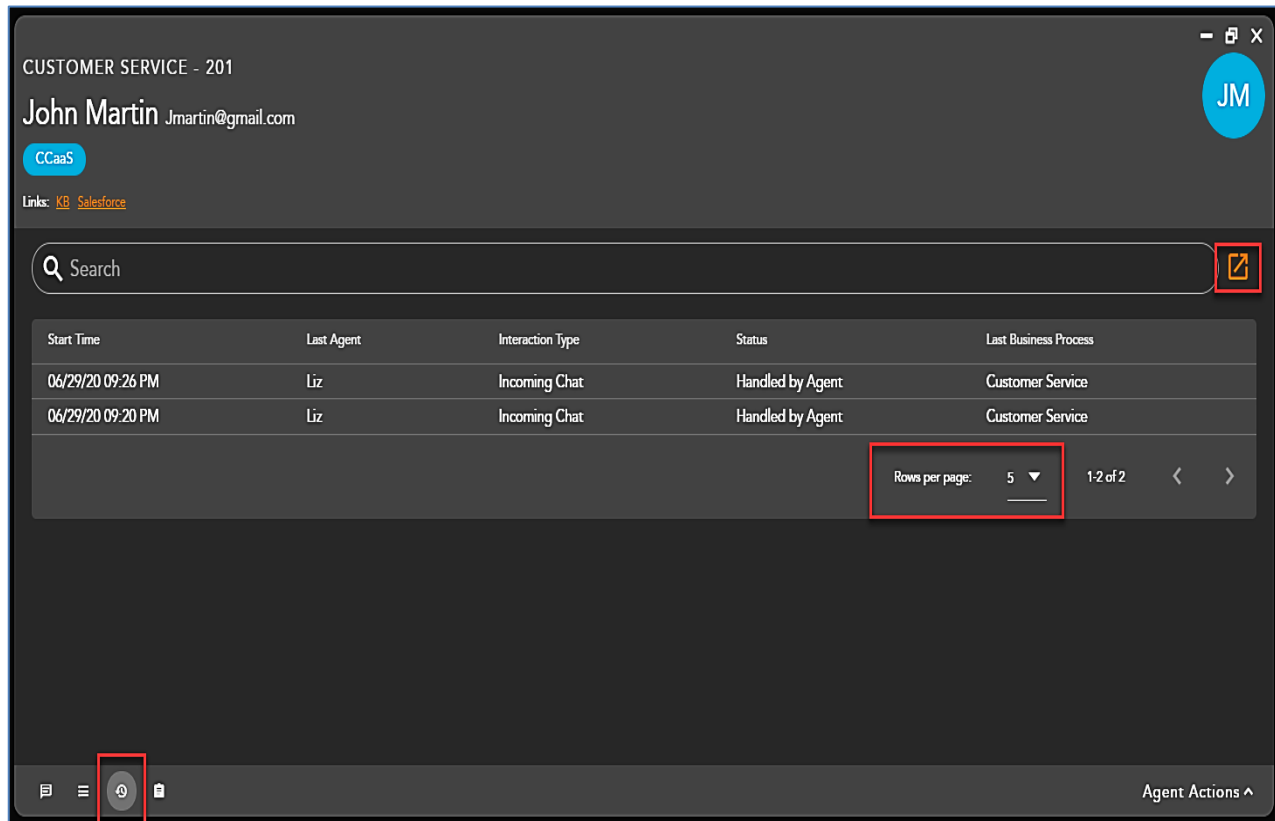


or an *invalid character* is entered



The input must be corrected for the contact information to save.

History displays the contacts historical interactions. The default view displays the five most recent historical interactions. To display more interactions, select the desired value (5, 10, 15 or All Interactions) from the Rows per page drop-down. The minimized historical interaction view shows the following information:

1. **Start Time:** Start time of the interaction
2. **Last Agent:** Last agent that handled the interaction
3. **Interaction Type:** Interaction Type of the historical interaction (chat, telephony, or email)
4. **Status:** Interaction Status
5. **Last Business Process:** Business Process the interaction was handled

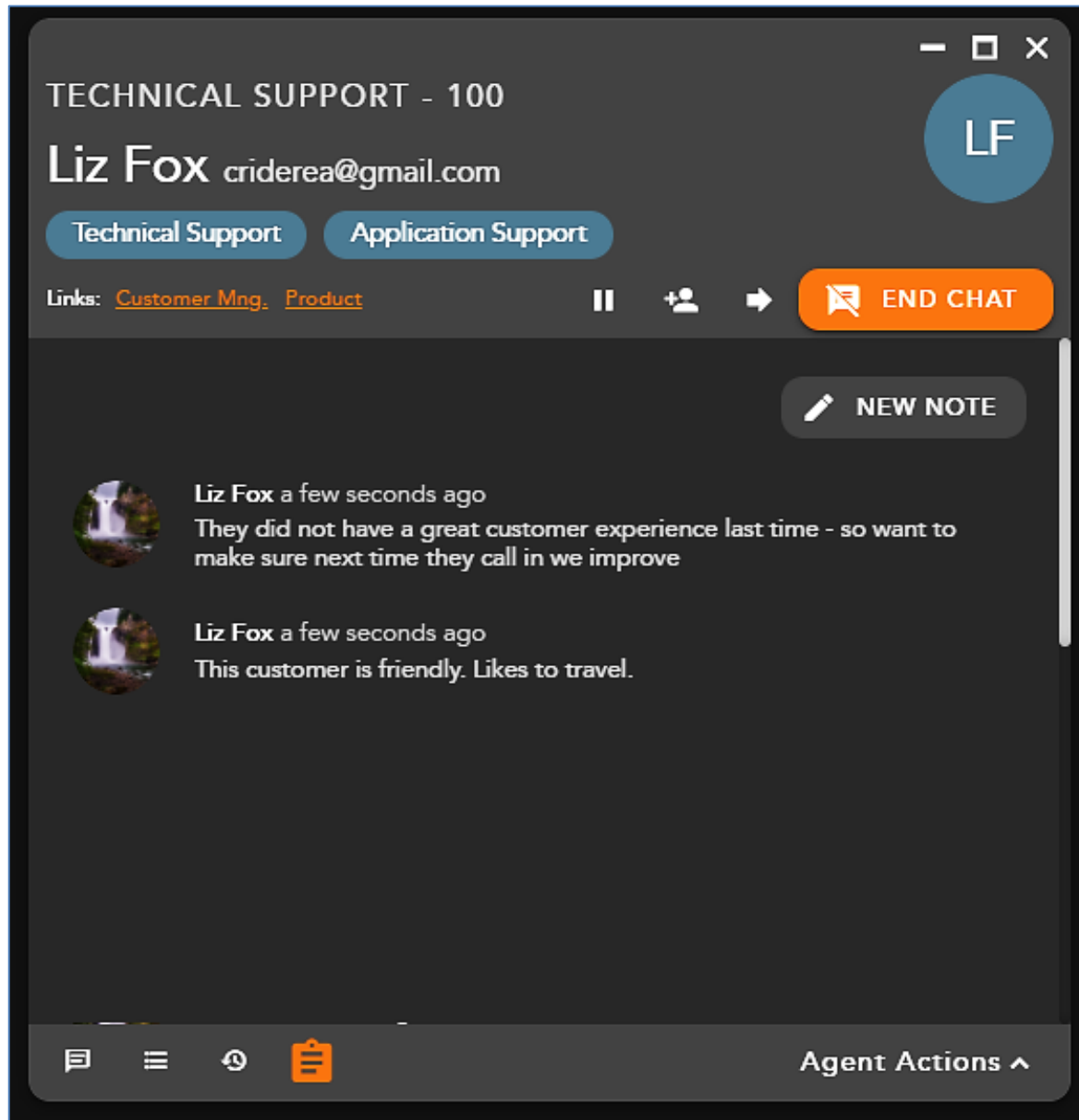

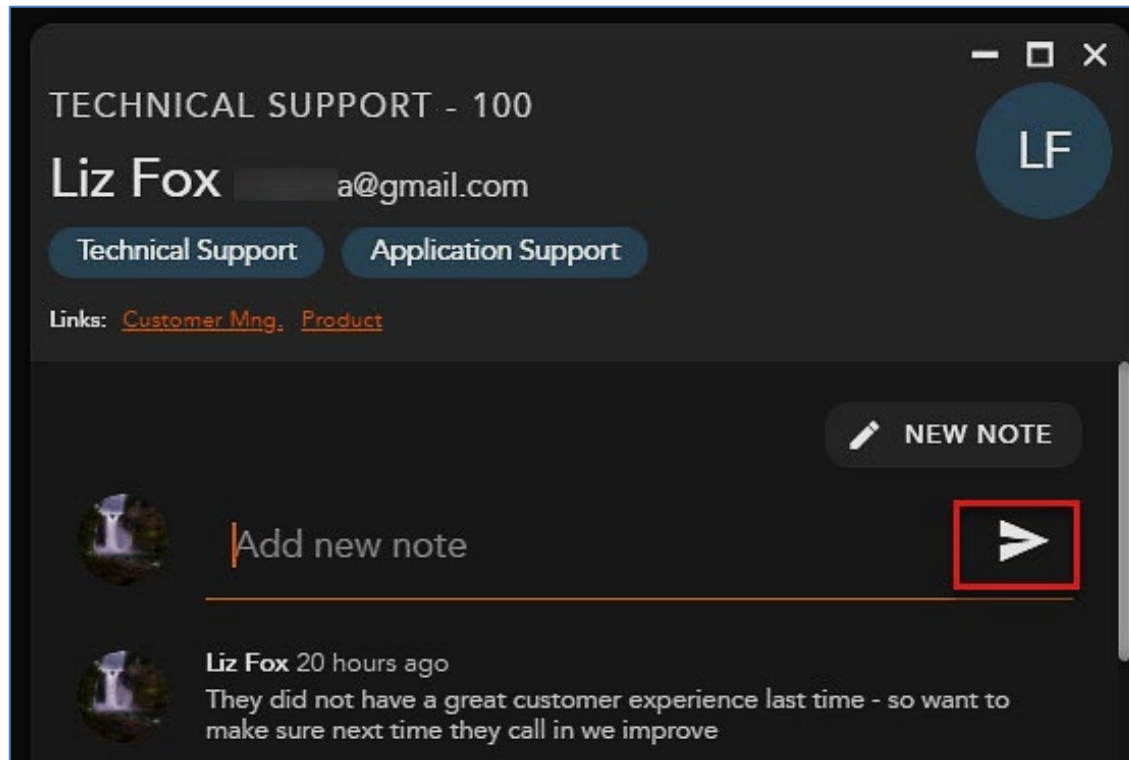

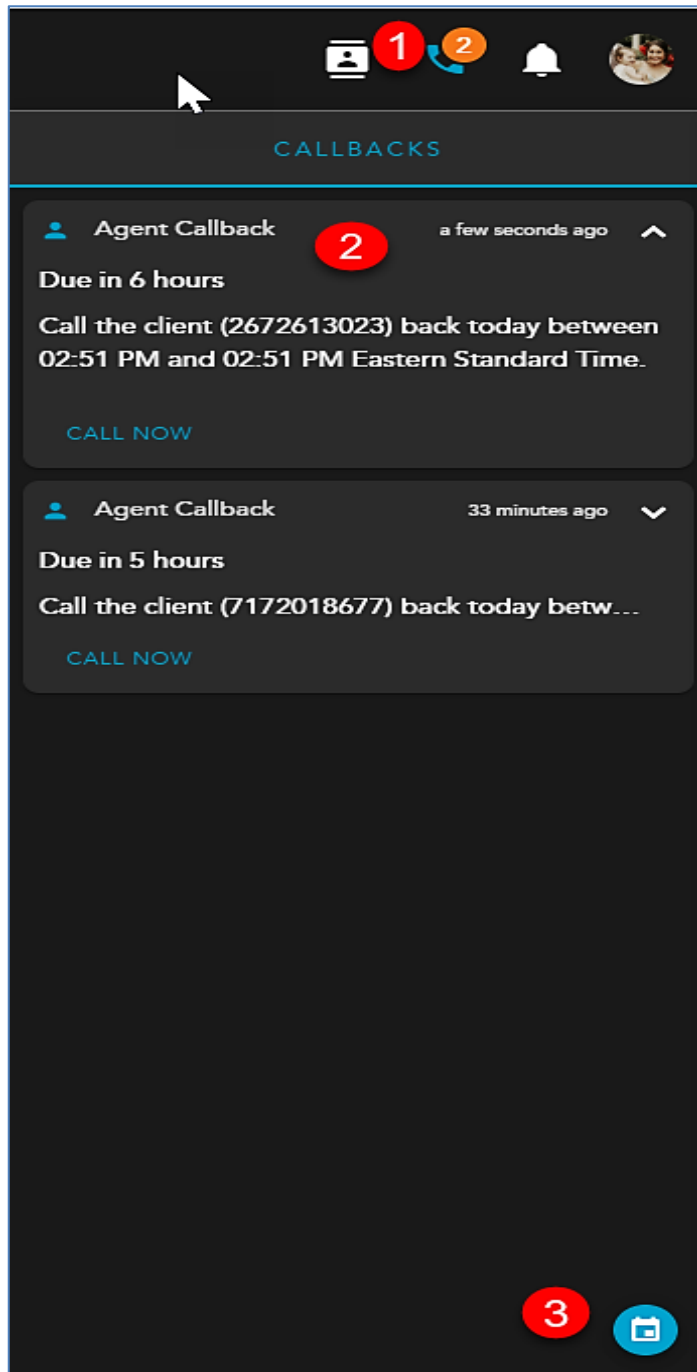


Handling Callback Interactions

Overview

Agents have the ability to assign a callback (if the feature is enabled for the agent profile) through the callback pop up on an active interaction or within the Call History Panel after wrapping up a telephony interaction. Agents will also have the ability to generate a brand new callback, not tied to a specific telephony interaction within the Callback Panel itself. This allows the agent flexibility and time to schedule a customer callback that isn't tied to a specific wrap up time frame or additional work needed to be completed in between interactions.

Interacting with the Callback Panel



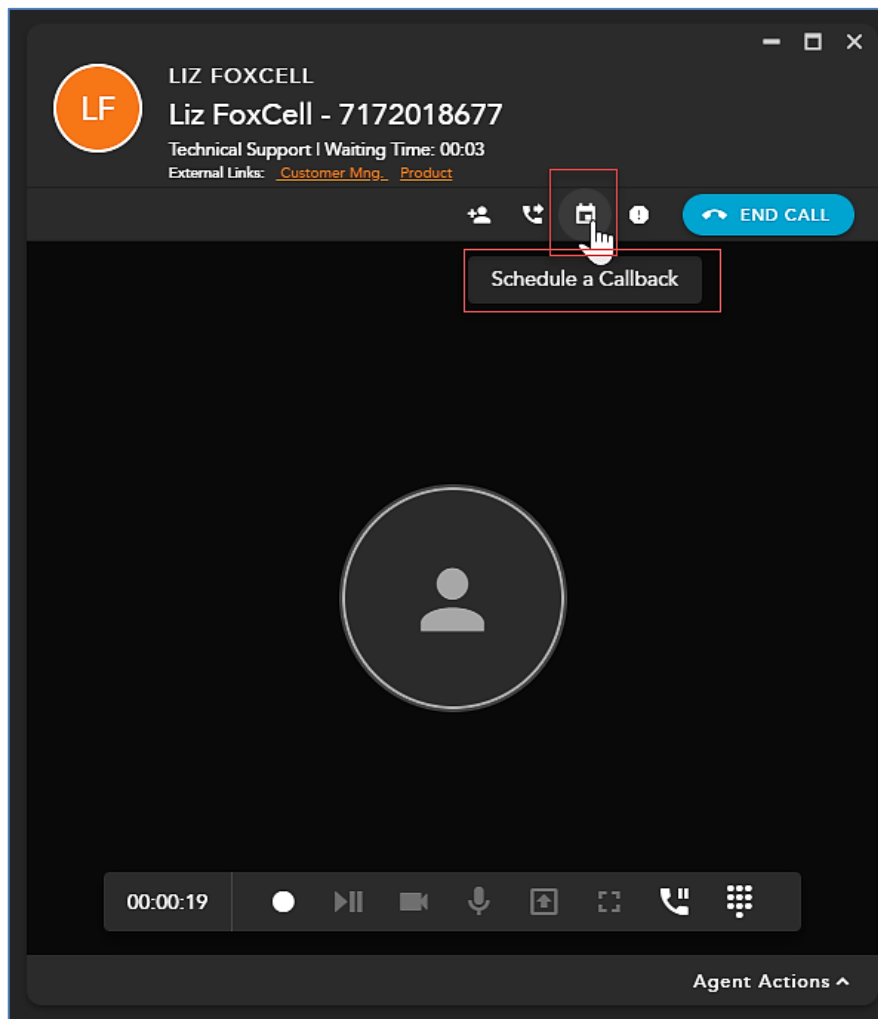
1. **Callback Panel Icon** - Indicates how many callbacks you have pending. Click on the icon to expand the Callback Panel for more details on your pending callbacks. Click on the icon to close the Callback Panel.

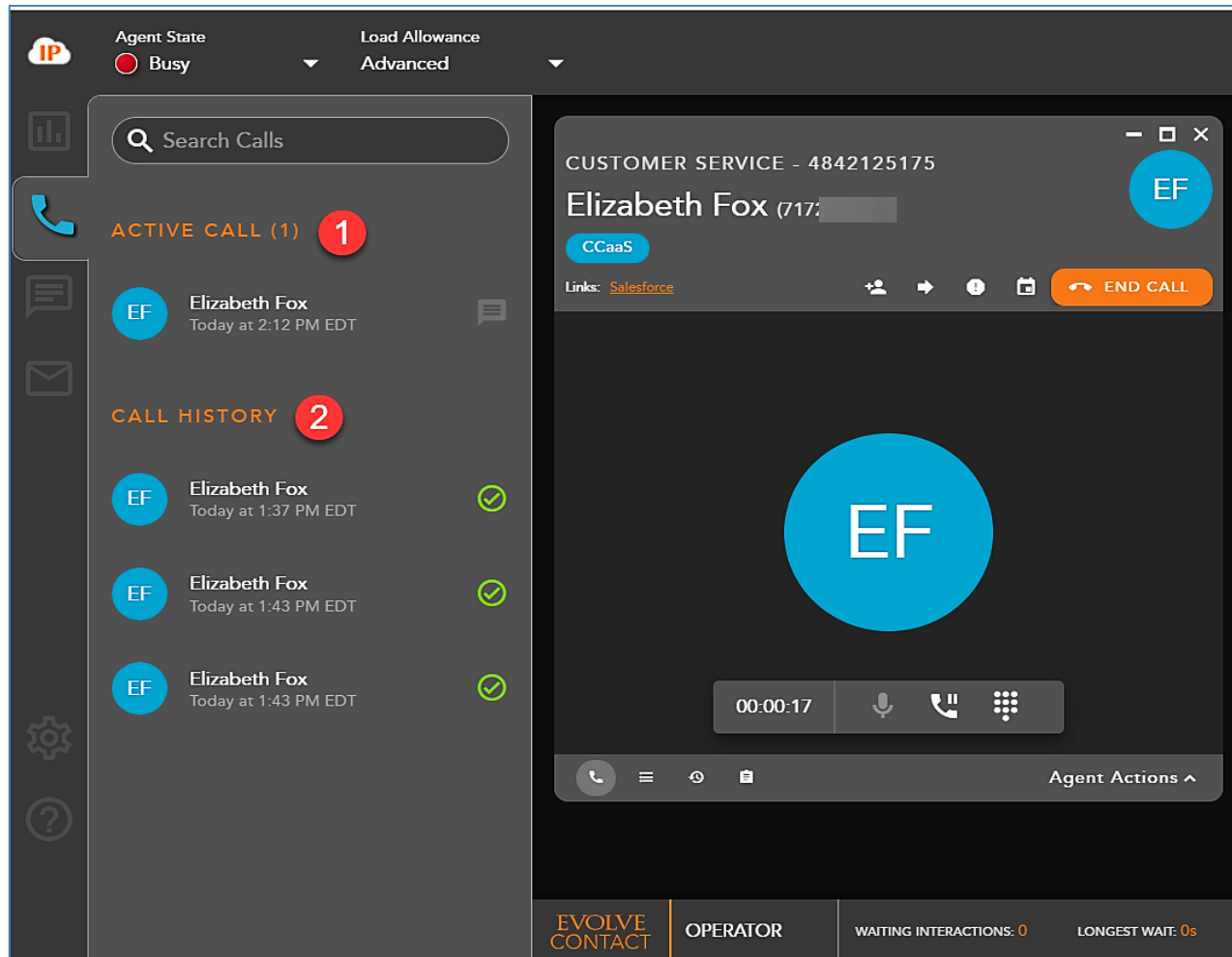
1. **Telephony Interaction Header** - displays the following information regarding the contact:
 - a. Customer Name and DID
 - b. Originating Business Process
 - c. **Demands** - specific demands assigned to the interaction via the handling flow and utilized to assign the interaction to the appropriate agent

- d. **External Links** - hyperlink to open to a URL configured in the Setup client. If the agent is set to always be recorded no call recording controls will be present. Controls will only be present if the agent can start/stop or pause/resume a recording.

10. **Agent Actions** - selecting agent actions will change the telephony screen to show the following options:
 - a. **Disposition Code** - pre-defined code to indicate the outcome of the interaction. These codes are specific to the Business Process and can be customized for each Business Process.
 - b. **Completion Status** - explanation as to why the interaction ended. A status may be selected during or after an interaction. The completion statuses available will depend on the type of interaction handled
 - c. **Remarks** - custom remarks relevant to the interaction and customer. Remarks are saved and available for review on the next interaction the customer has with the contact center and can be found in the CRM panel under Notes and Remarks.
11. **Contact** - saved contact information. If the CRM panel is enabled through the Setup client, you will be able to edit an existing contacts information or add a *new* contact to the contact management system if they are new to the contact center.
12. **History** - displays all interaction history the contact has had with the contact center
13. **Notes and Remarks** - will display all system and agent added remarks and notes for the contact.

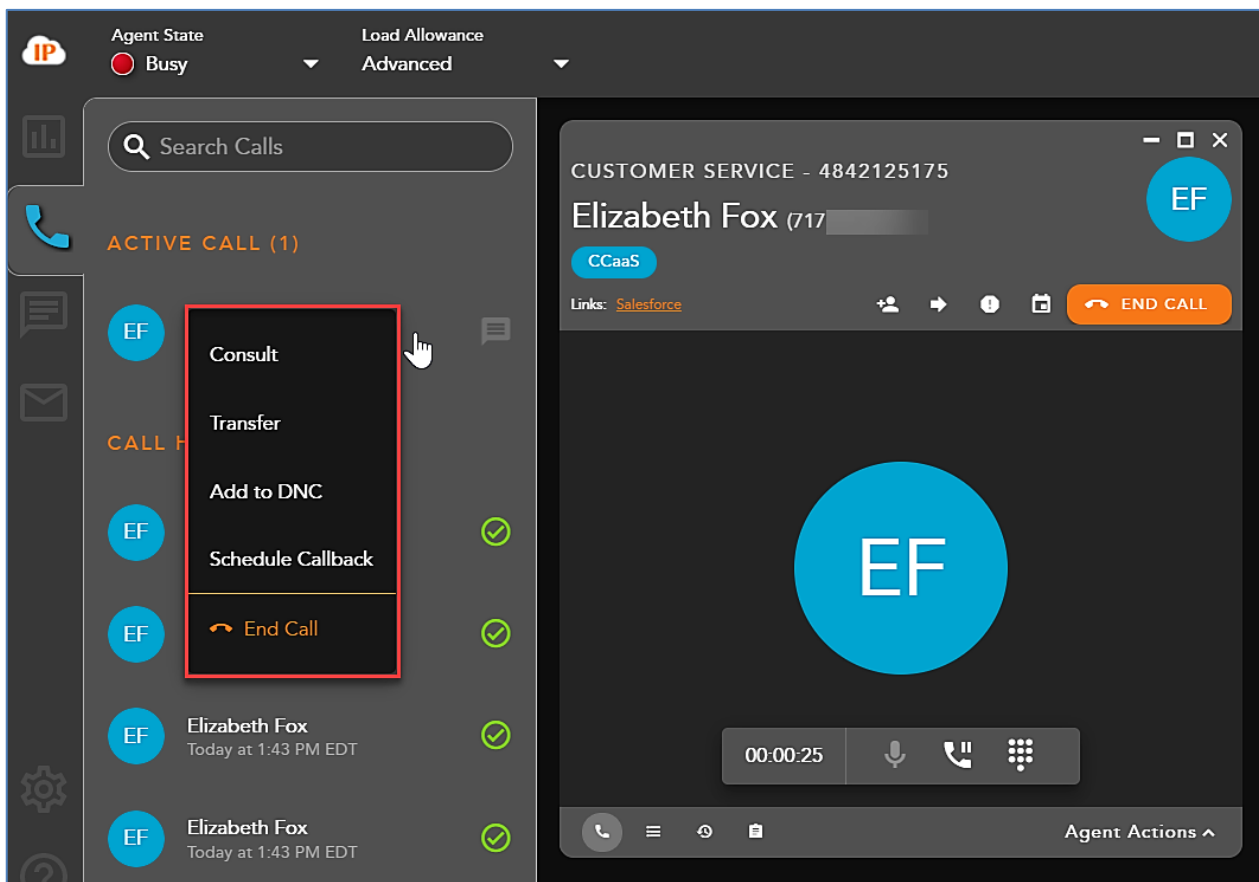
Active Call Interactions

The Active Call field displays all active call interactions. Each active call will display the name of the contact and the current call duration

If a call is put on hold the *Active Call header* will change to **On Hold** and the active call icon will change to show which call is currently on hold.



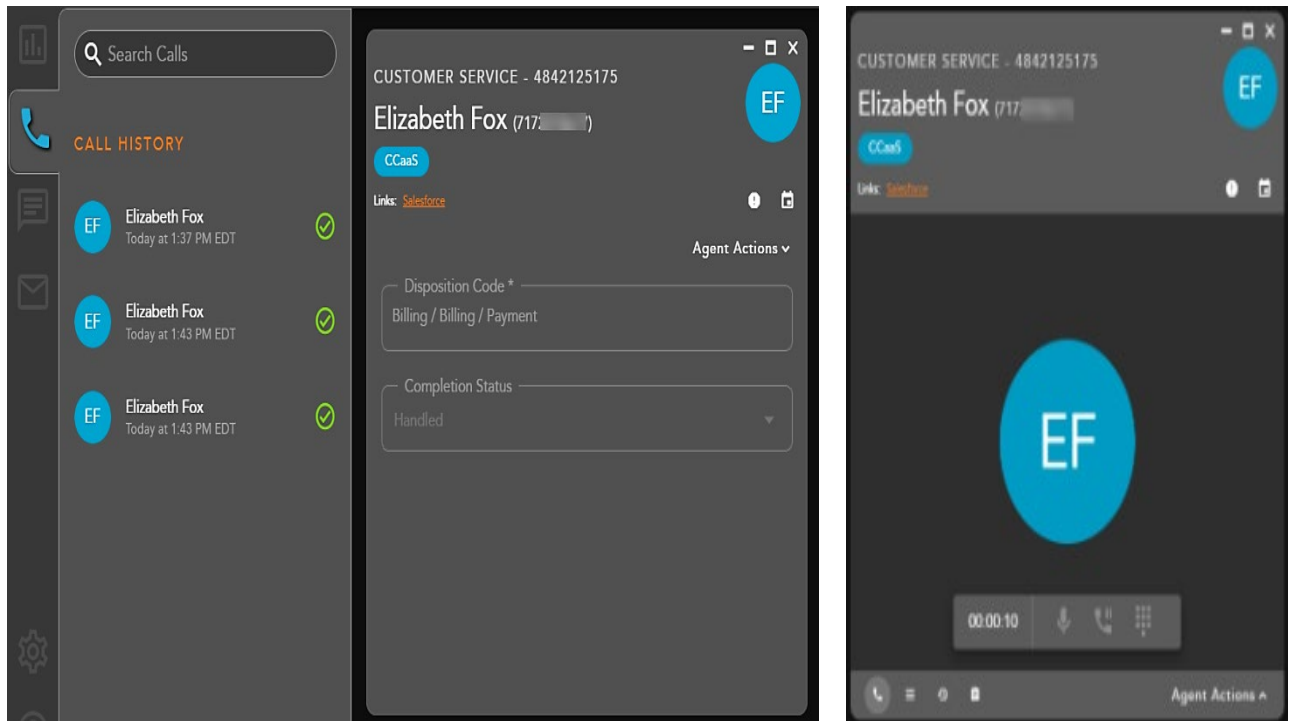

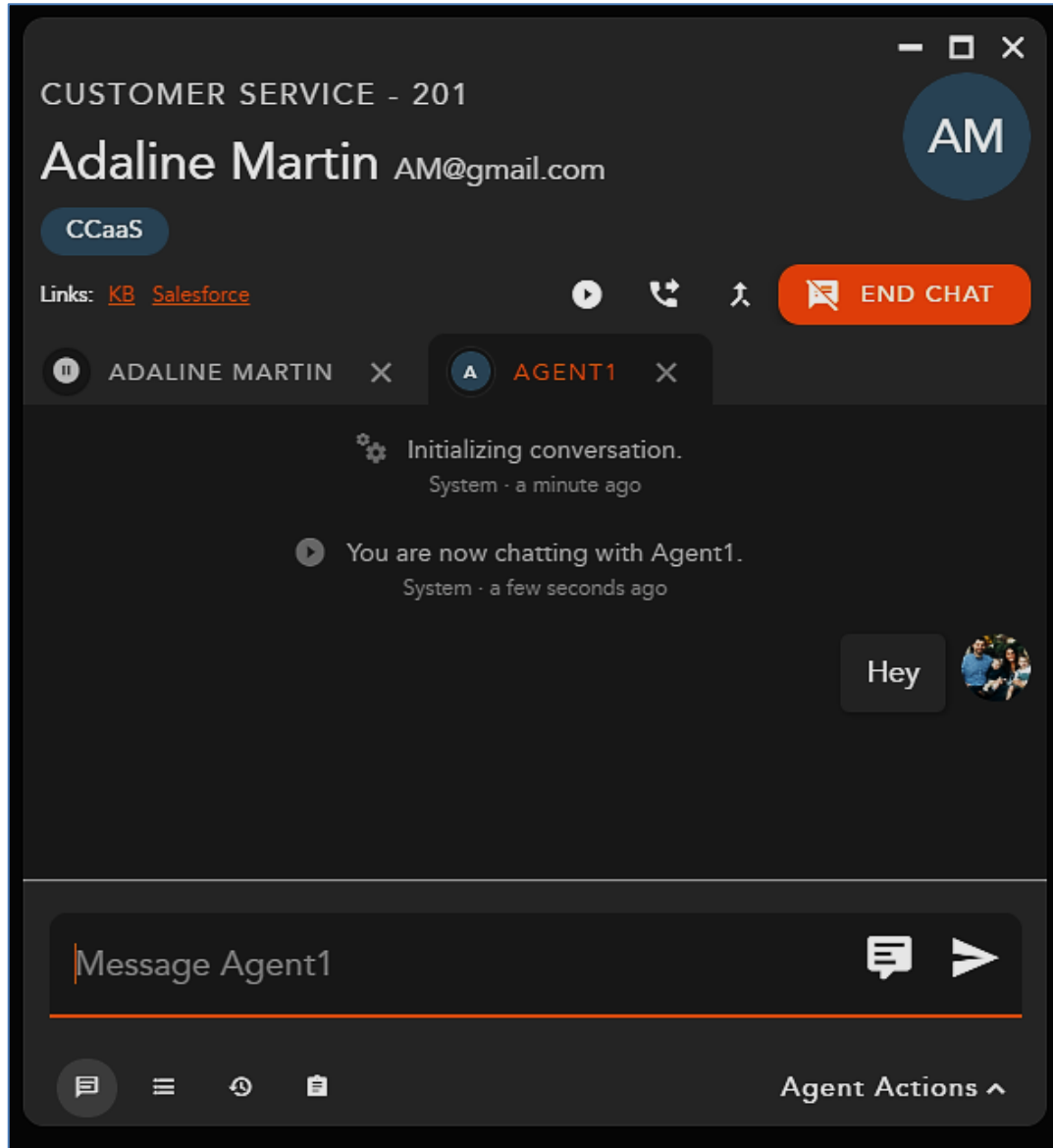
Within the search bar you can type the name or the User, Business Process, or Channel you wish to transfer the interaction. As you begin to type, the window will filter each category and make available only the contacts that match your search criteria.



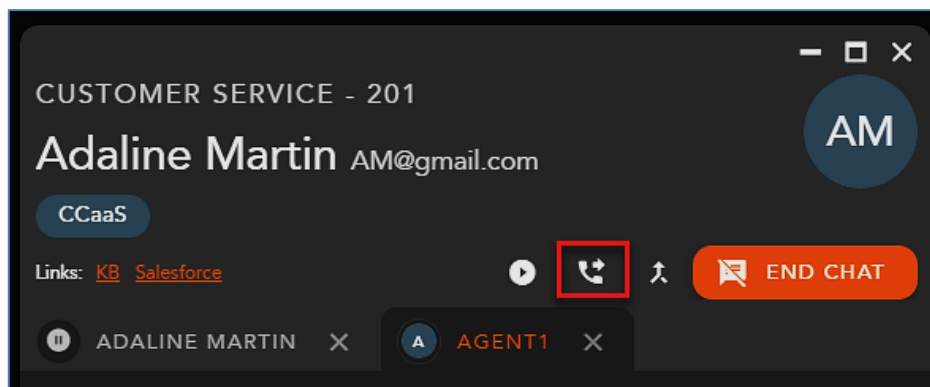
Select the *transfer arrow* to initiate the consulted transfer.

Your chat window will split into two tabs. The first tab is the conversation between you and the customer. The second tab is the initiated consult between you and the Agent, Supervisor, Business Process, or Channel.

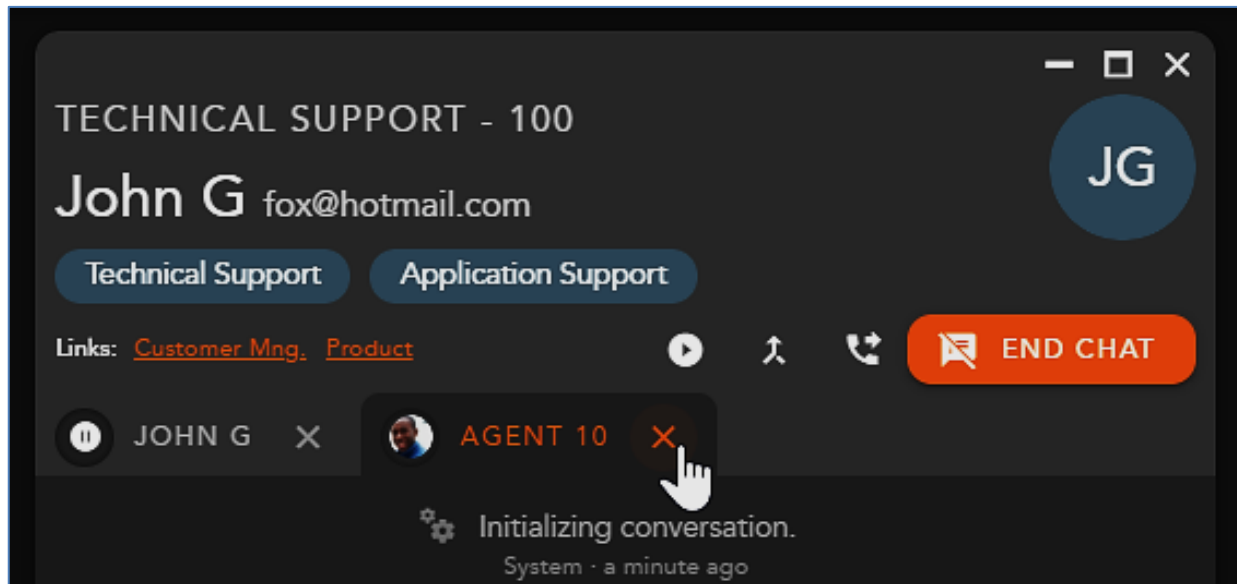
The chat window will provide a confirmation message when the consulted contact has accepted your chat.



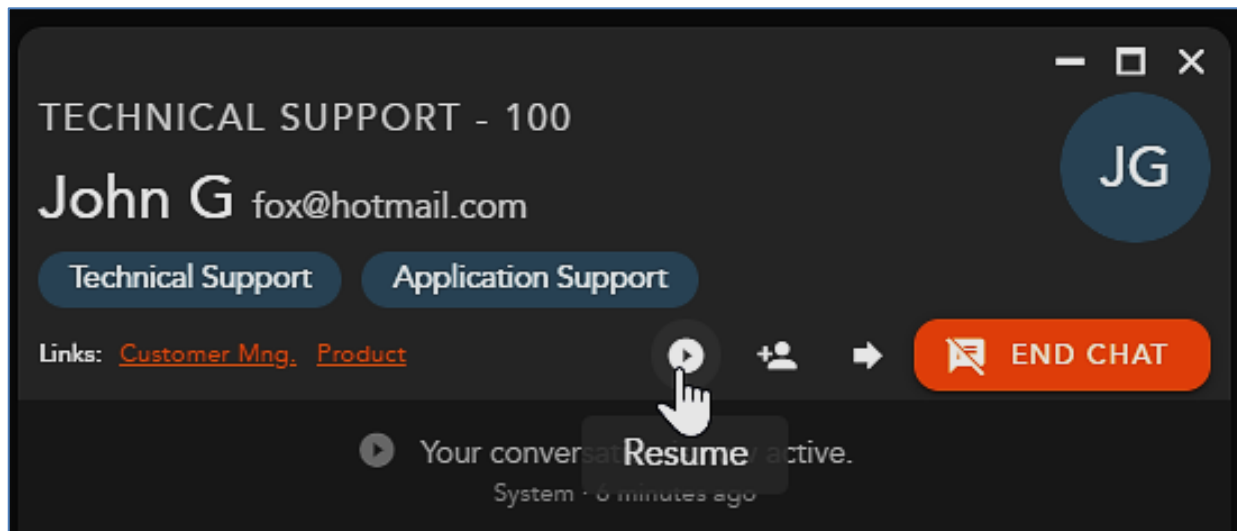
To complete the consulted transfer select the **transfer** icon.



The interaction window will disappear followed by a **transfer success message**.
To cancel the consulted transfer select the X in the tab of the consulted party.



This will end the consult and return to the original chat interaction. The message window will be grayed out and you will be unable to type a response until you have selected the **resume icon** to continue the chat interaction.






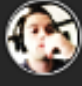

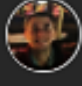
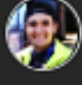

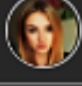
Initiate a Conference

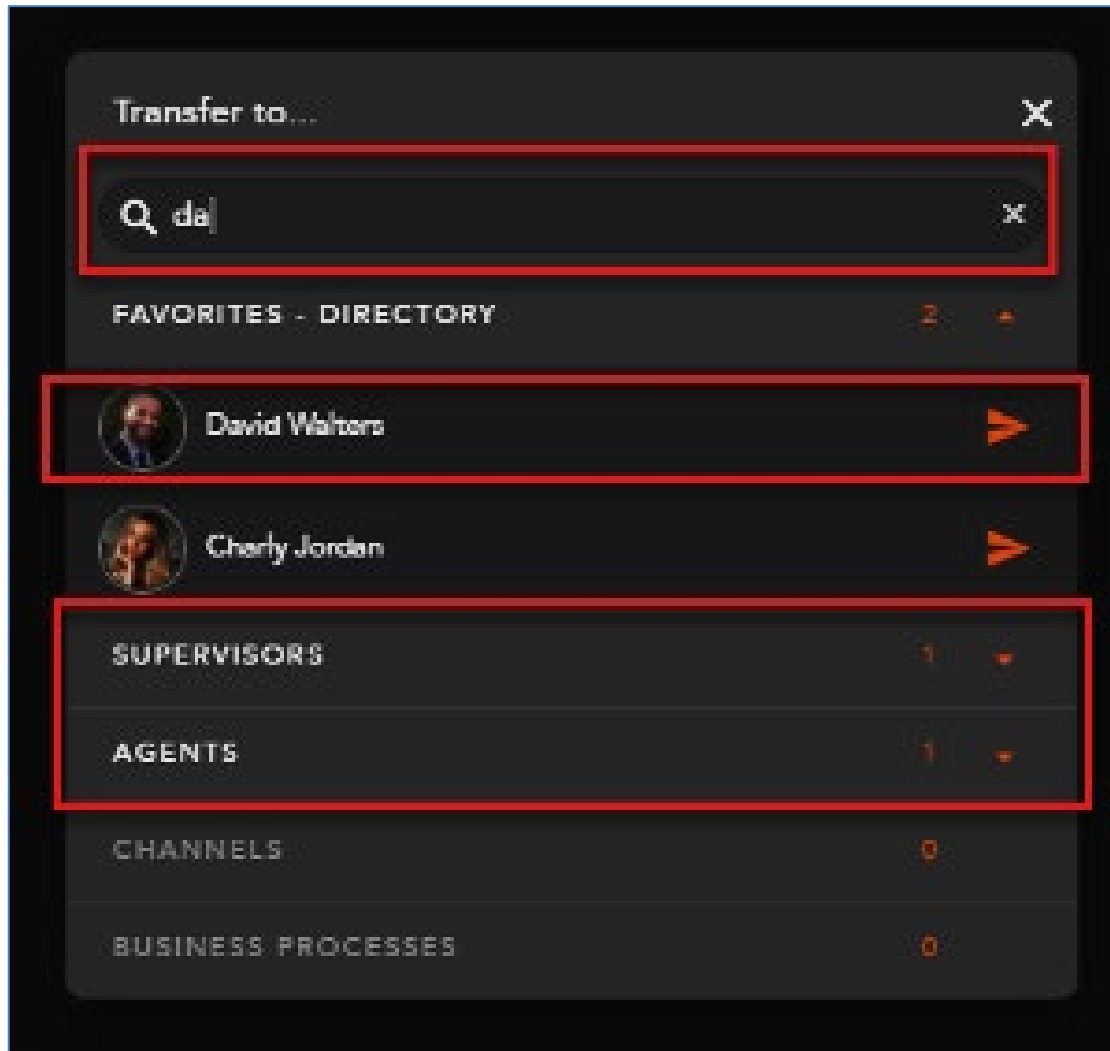

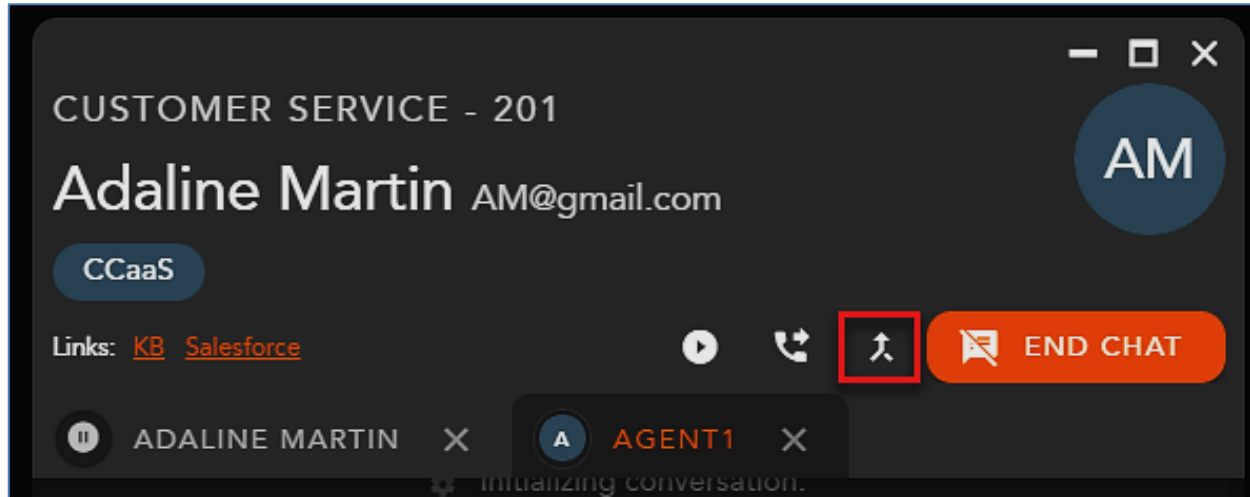
*If initiating a Conference with an agent or supervisor they must be in a Ready or Handling Outgoing state. If you attempt to initiate a conference with a Busy agent or supervisor, you will receive an error message.



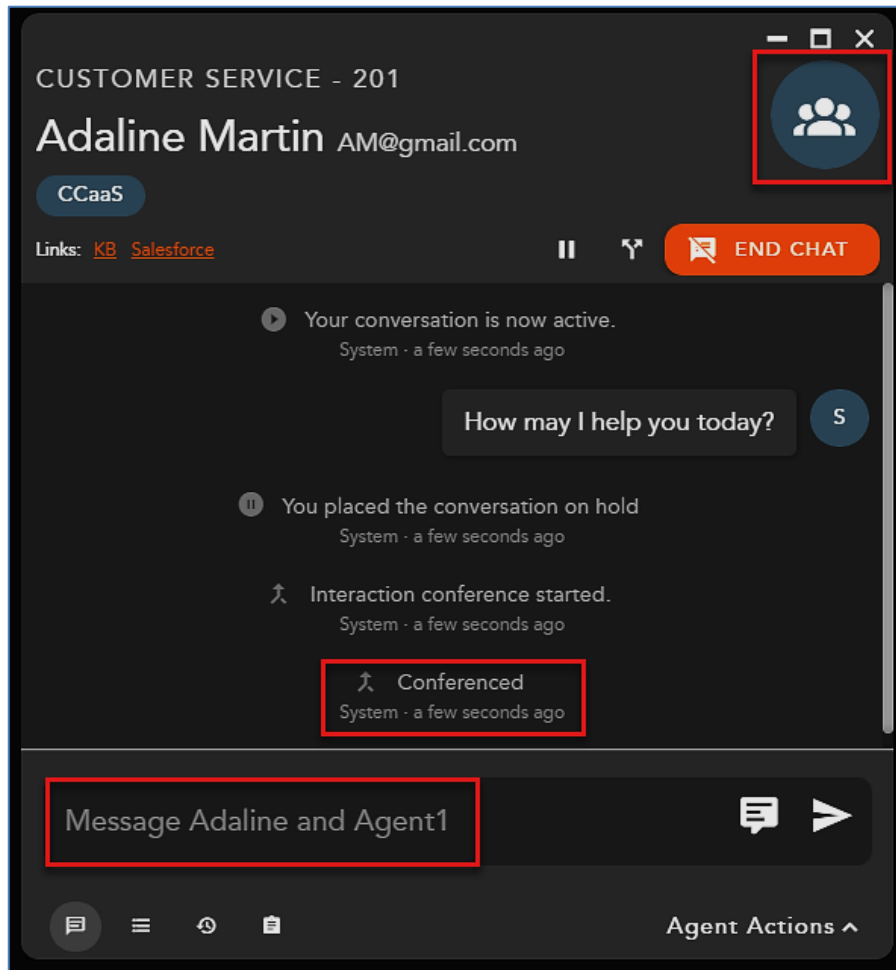
Select the *arrow* to the right to initiate the conference.

Your chat window will split into two tabs. The first tab is the conversation between you and the customer. The second tab is the initiated conference between you and the Agent, Supervisor, or Business Process. The chat window will provide a confirmation message when the contact has accepted your chat.

When you are ready to pull the third party into the chat and begin a conference, select the **Conference Icon** found in the Interaction Toolbar.

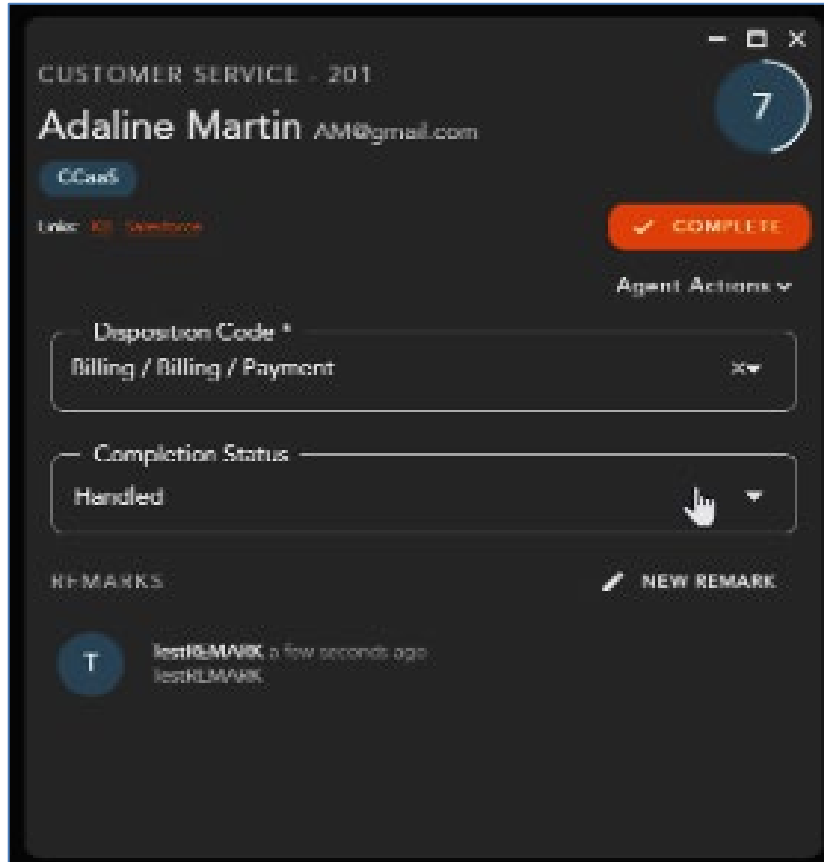


The two tabs will be merged into a single window. The message window will update to say *conferenced* to indicate a successful 3-way chat conference. The customer's avatar will also change to indicate you are currently in a conference.



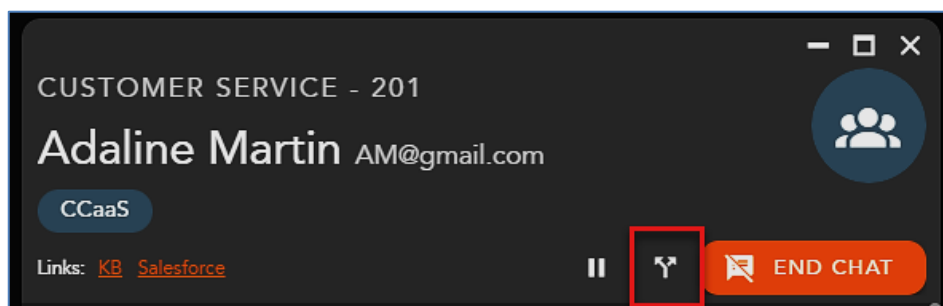
End a Conference

To end the conference and complete the interaction select **[End Chat]**. The interaction will end and all parties will be disconnected from the interactions. The Agent Actions will open to add a Disposition Code and Remarks, select Complete when ready to complete the interaction.

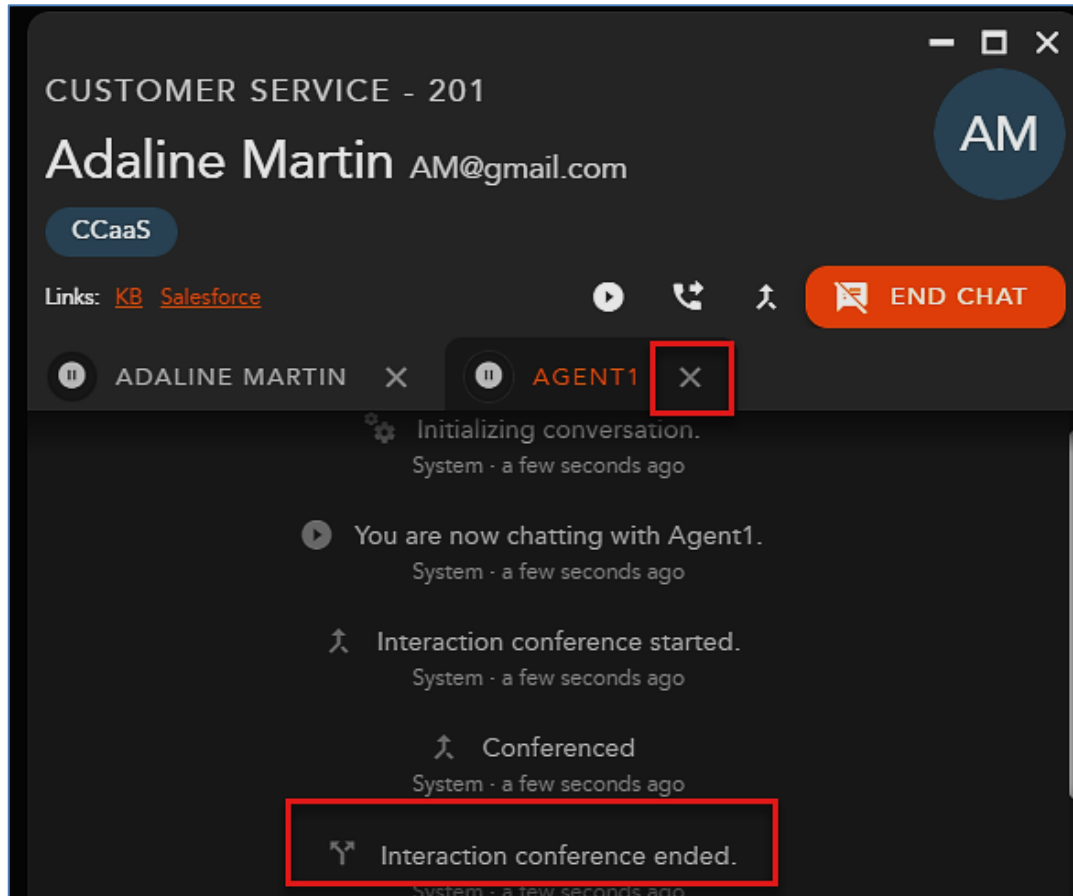


Split a Conference and Remove Consulted Party

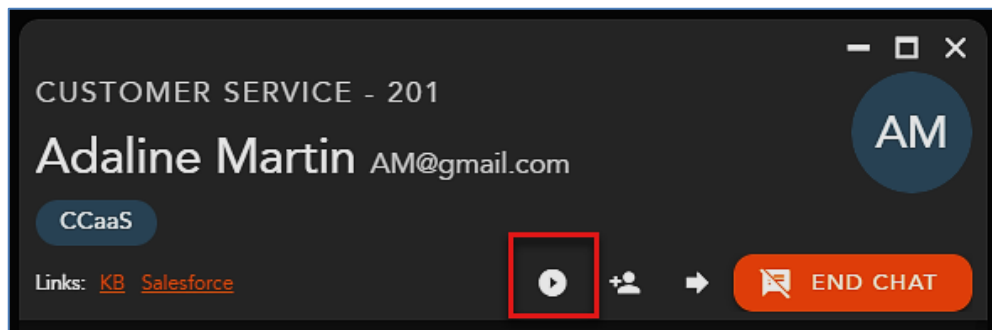
To end a conference and split it back into two separate interactions, select the **Split Conference** icon.



The chat window will split back into two chat tabs and a confirmation message that will display *“Interaction Conference Ended”* will show in the chat window. The first tab is the interaction between the customer and the agent and the second tab is the interaction between the agent and the consulted party. To remove the consulted party and resume the interaction with the customer, select the **X** icon on the tab.

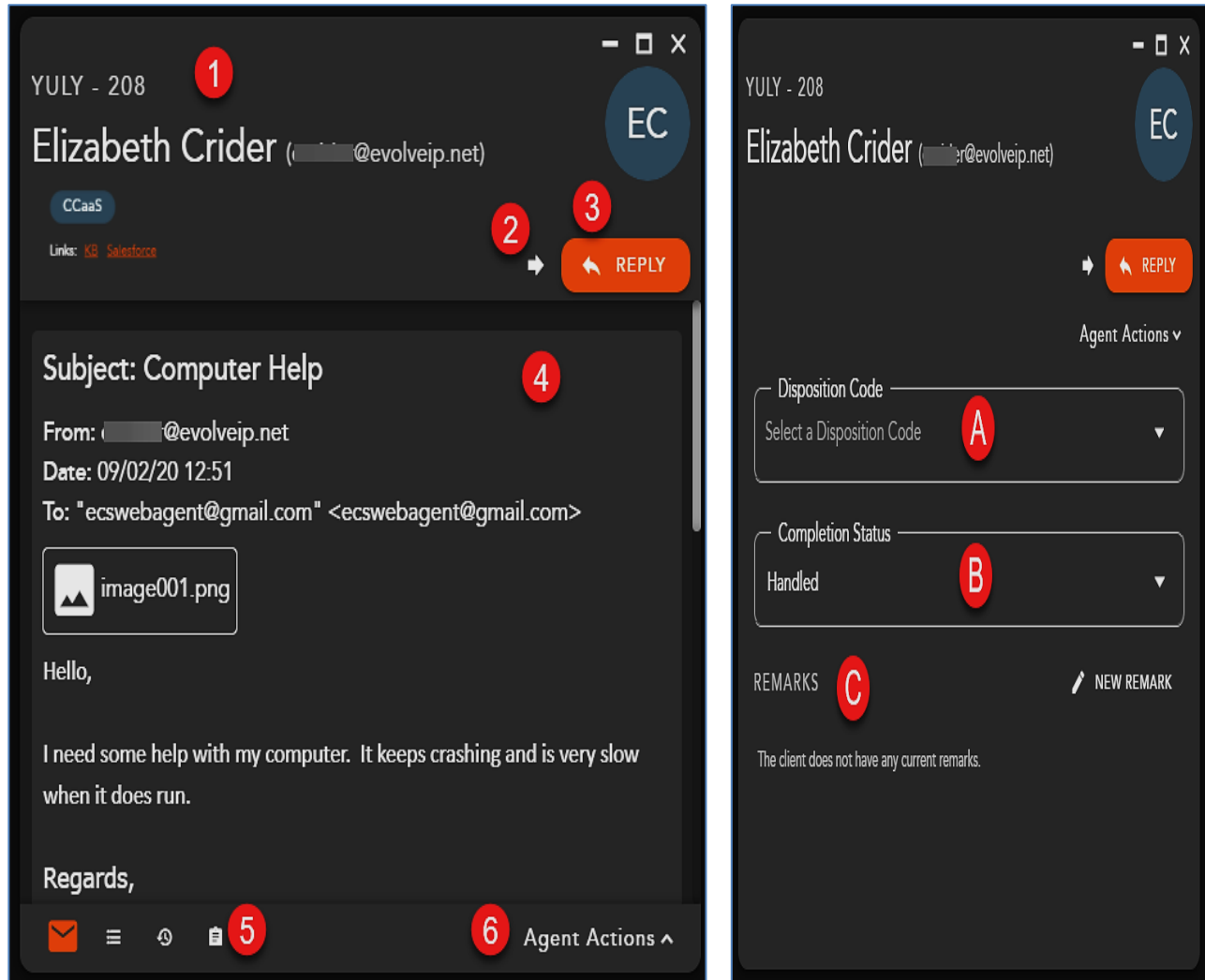


Once selected the consulted party will be removed and the interaction will revert back to the main interaction window. The contact will be on hold. Resume the interaction, by selecting the **Resume** icon on the Interaction Toolbar.



Handling Email Interactions

Email Interaction Interface



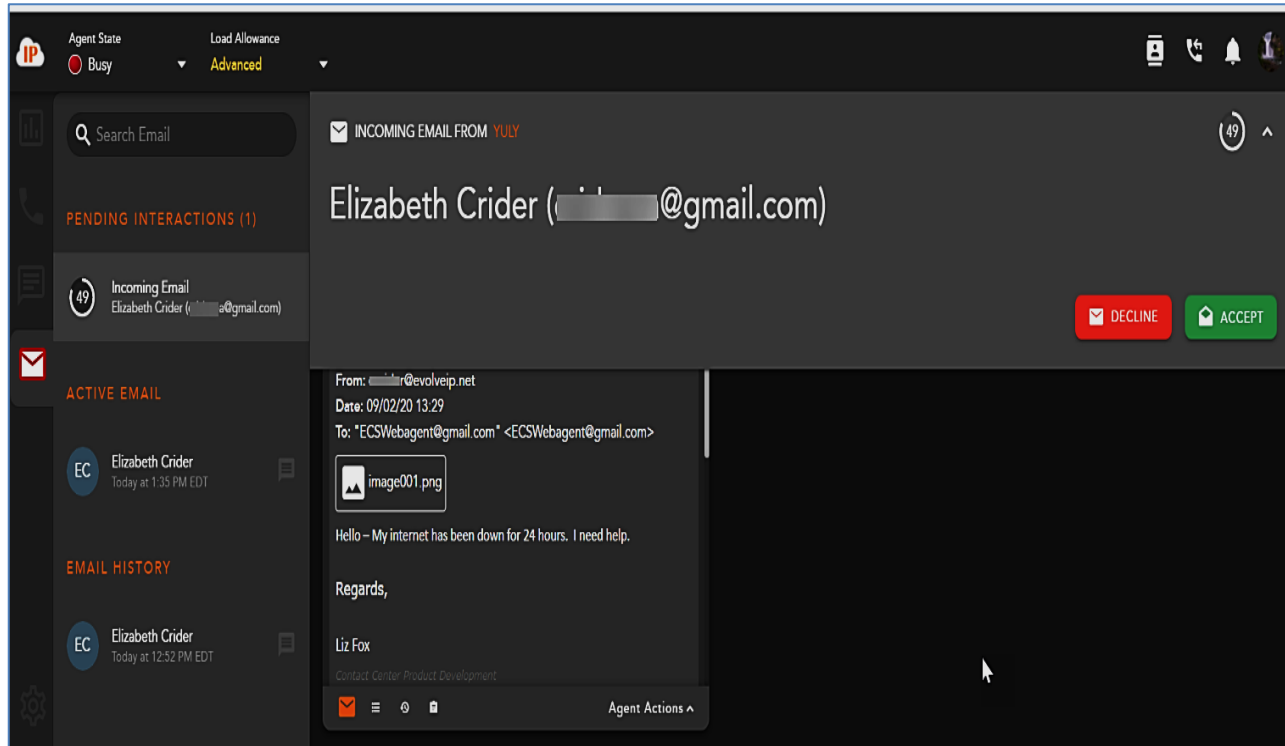
1. **Email Interaction Header** - displays the following information:
 - a. Originating Business Process
 - b. Name and Email Address
 - c. Demands
 - d. External Links - hyperlink to open to a URL configured in the Setup client. The links can integrate with a CRM or internal knowledge base, which contains specific information about a customer or help documents. By clicking on a link, you will be redirected to the predefined URL, providing more detailed information on the person they are working with or help documentation.

2. **Transfer** - initiates a blind transfer to another Agent, Supervisor or Business Process.
3. **Reply** - opens the email interaction to allow the agent to provide a response. Once an agent has opted to reply to an email interaction, they no longer can transfer the email to another agent, supervisor, or Business Process. They must either cancel out the interaction without providing a response or reply to the email interaction.
4. **Email Body** - Will contain the Subject, From: Sender, Date, To: Email Destination, and body of the email
5. **Interaction Footer** - contains the CRM information for the contact - Contacts, History and Notes/Remarks.
6. **Agent Actions** - selecting agent actions will change the chat screen to show the following options:
 - a. **Disposition Code** - pre-defined code to indicate the outcome of the interaction. These codes are specific to the Business Process and can be customized for each Business Process.
 - b. **Completion Status** - explanation as to why the interaction ended. A status may be selected during or after an interaction. The completion statuses available will depend on the type of interaction handled
 - c. **Remarks** - custom remarks relevant to the interaction and customer. Remarks are saved and available for review on the next interaction the customer has with the contact center and can be found in the CRM panel under Notes and Remarks

Email Panel

The email panel displays your:

1. Pending Interactions
2. Active Chats
3. Chat History



Pending Email Interactions

Within settings, agents can choose how they wish to display their incoming interactions: Banner & Panel, Banner only, or Panel only. If Banner & Panel or Panel is chosen, any incoming pending interaction will show up in the Email panel. It will provide the No Answer Time Out countdown, Interaction Type and Originating Business Process, Name and Email address. If the agent chooses to only display incoming interactions through the Banner, the interaction panel will not display pending interactions.

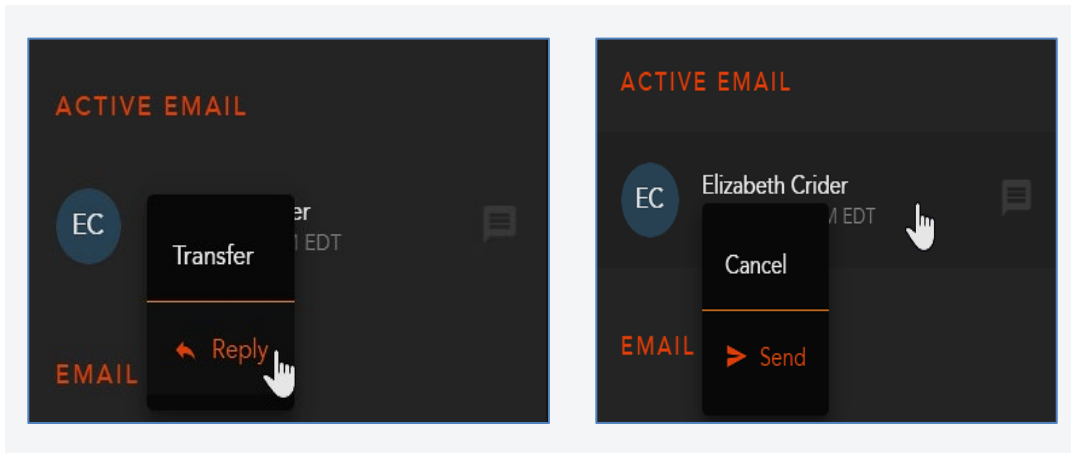
From the panel, by right clicking on the pending email interaction, the agent can accept or decline the interaction.



Active Emails

The Active Email session displays all active Email interactions. Each active Email will display the name of the contact and the date and time the interaction was received.

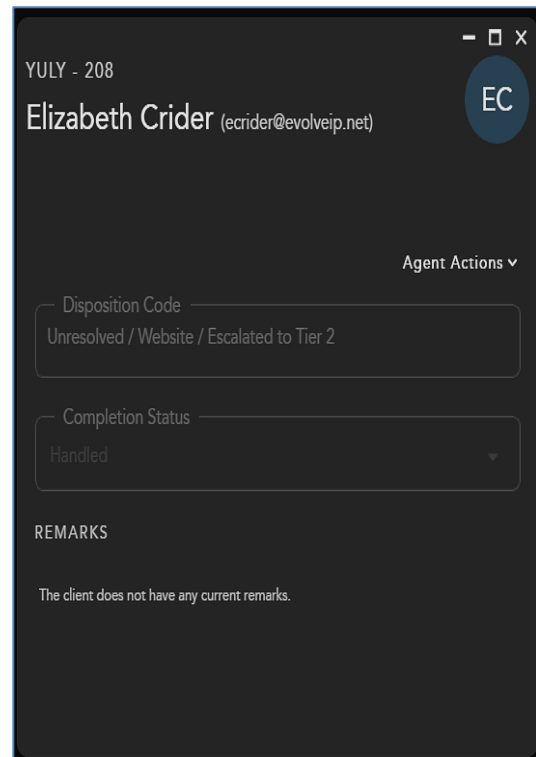
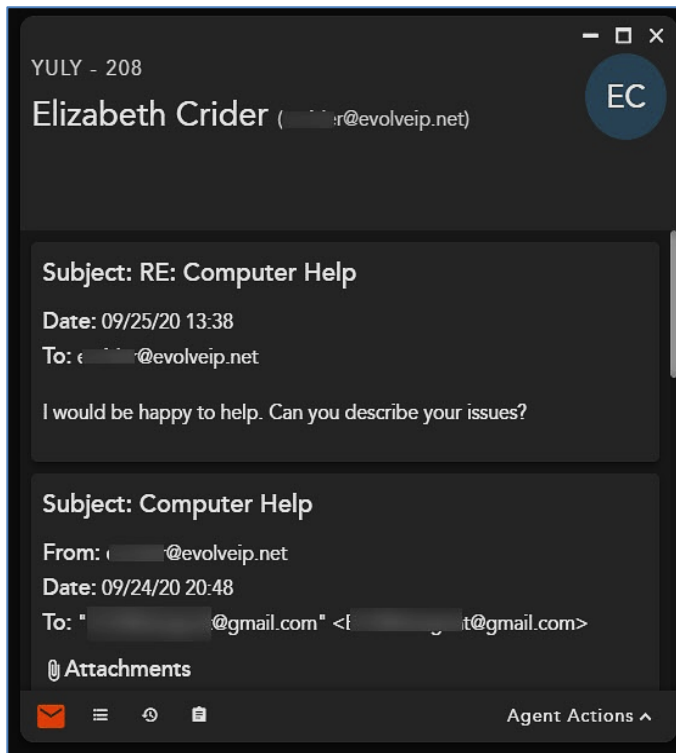
By right clicking on an active email within the panel, you will have interaction control to *Transfer/Reply* or *Cancel/Send* an email. If an agent chooses to reply to an email, the interaction controls will change to cancel or send a reply to the email interaction.



Email History

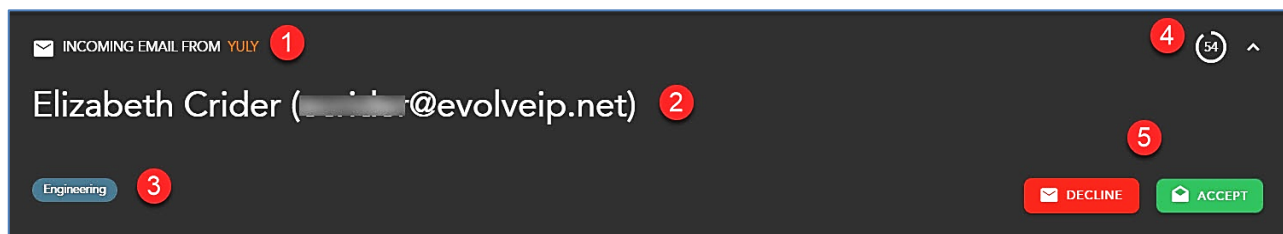
Email history will show all recent historical email interactions, including the customer name, date and time the interaction was handled.

Double click on an interaction will open the historical interaction and display the email history, completion status, and disposition code applied to the interaction.

Accepting a Email Interaction



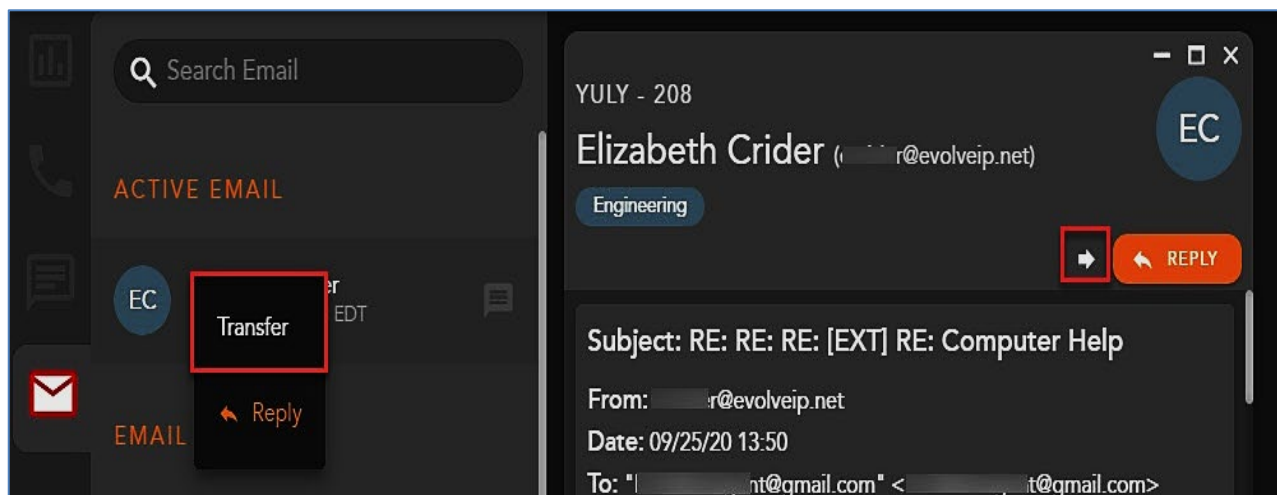
When a new email interaction is being offered to an agent the following information will be present for review before accepting the interaction:

1. The Interaction Type and Originating Business Process
2. Name and Email Address
3. **Interaction Handling Remarks and Demands** - prepopulated through the Interaction Handling Flow configured in the Setup client. If no remarks are present for the interaction this field will not be visible on the interaction. Specific demands assigned to the interaction via the handling flow and utilized to assign the interaction to the appropriate agent

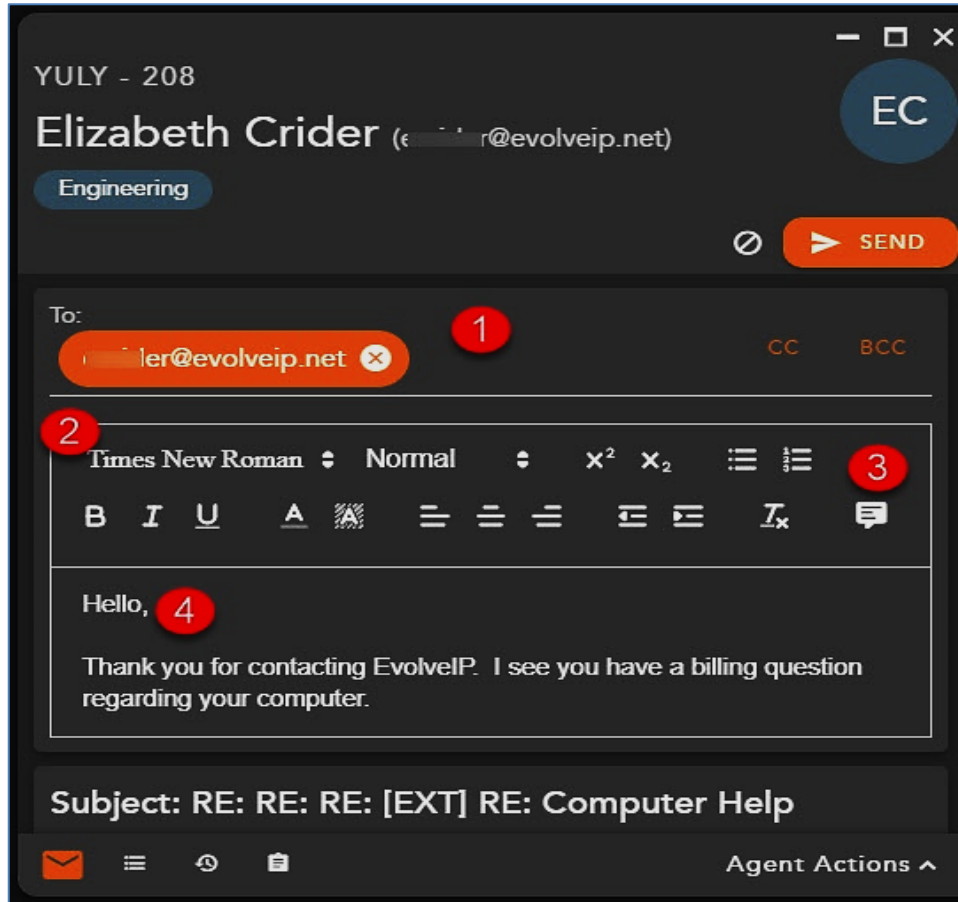
4. **No Answer Time Out** - preconfigured in the Setup Client. If the interaction is not answered within this timer, you will be put into a No Answer State.
5. **Decline or Accept** - Accept or Decline the incoming interaction
 - a. To accept and reply to the incoming email, select the **[Accept]** icon
 - b. To decline the interaction and send the interaction back to queue, select the **[Decline]** icon. Note, if you are the only ready agent in the Business Process, the interaction will continue to present itself until accepted or another agent becomes ready.

Reply to an Email

Once an email interaction has been accepted, the agent will have a chance to preview the email before deciding if they can provide a reply. If the agent wishes to reply to the email, the agent can select *Reply* in the email interaction or right-click on the active email interaction from the App Side bar, then select **Reply**.

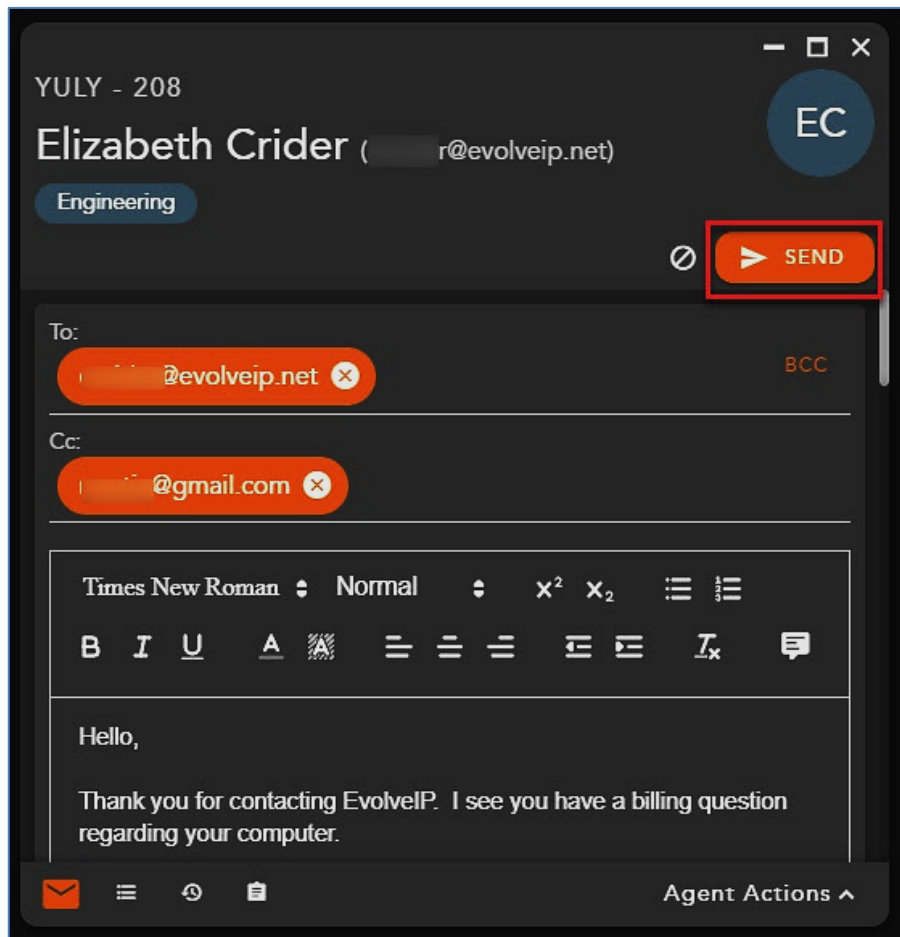


Once the agent has selected Reply, the email interaction window will update to allow the agent to send a response. Within the new window the agent will have the ability to:

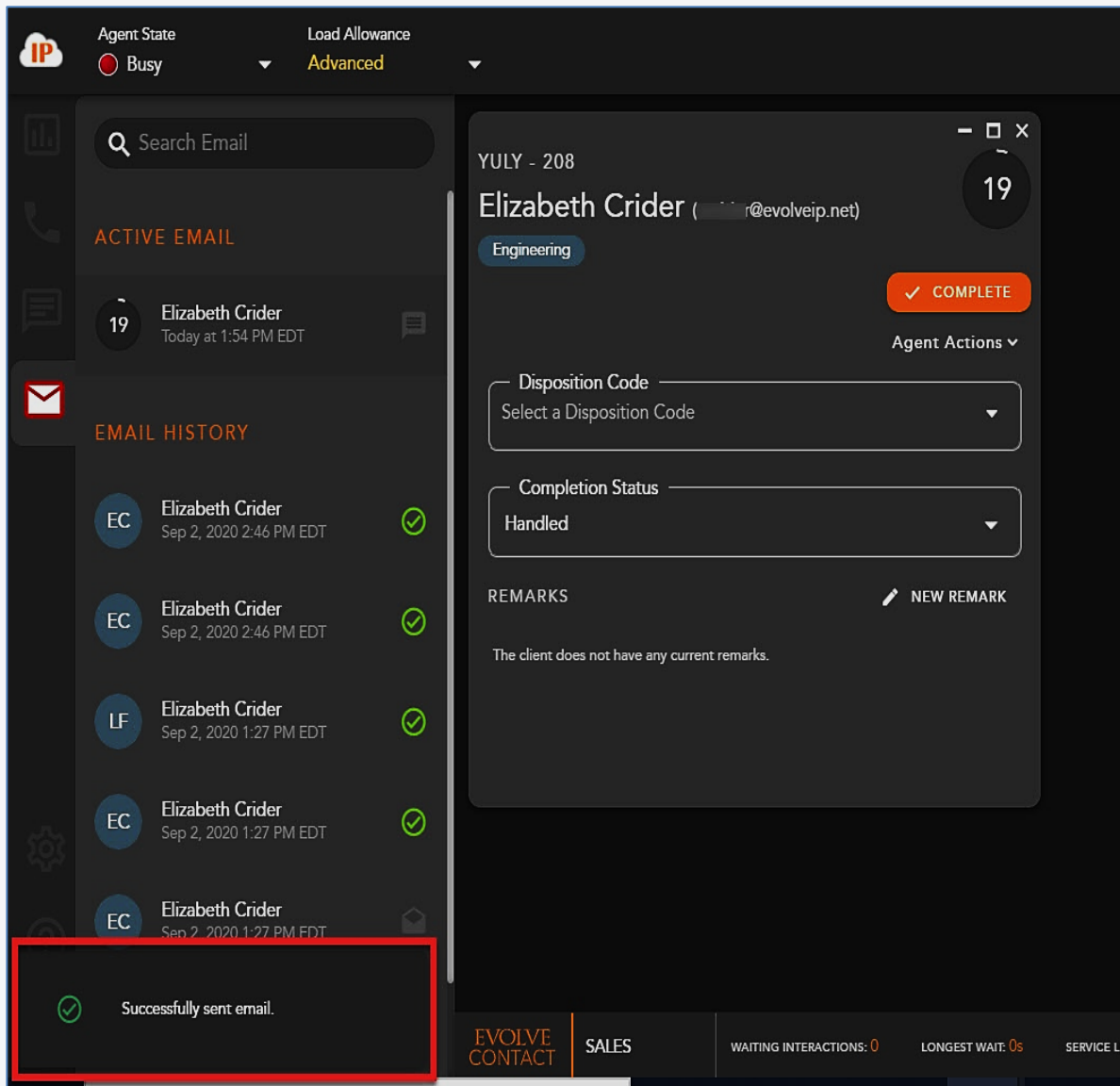


1. **To/CC/BCC** - Add additional email addresses to be included in the agents reply. The Agent can add additional email addresses to the To field or select the CC or BCC fields.
2. **Stylize Options** - stylize the email from the following options:
 - a. Font
 - b. Font Size
 - c. Bullets/Numbers
 - d. Bold/Italics/Underline
 - e. Font Color
 - f. Shading
 - g. Font Placement
3. **Canned Responses** - pre-configured email responses
4. **Email Body** - email response window, where the agent will type in the response to the email interaction

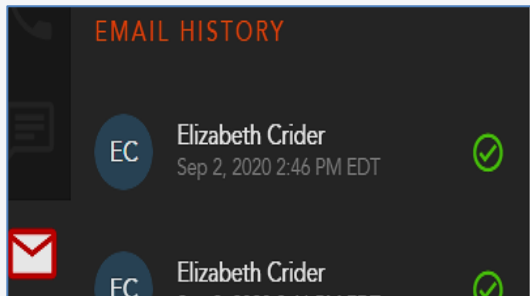
Once the agent has entered in the response and is ready to send, select **Send** in the interaction window.



A confirmation message will appear when the email was successfully sent. To complete the interaction, select a disposition code (*if mandatory*), a remark for the contact if needed, followed by Complete. Completing the interaction will end the interaction, moving the email to historical interaction in the App Side bar and changing the agent state to *Ready* to handle another interaction.

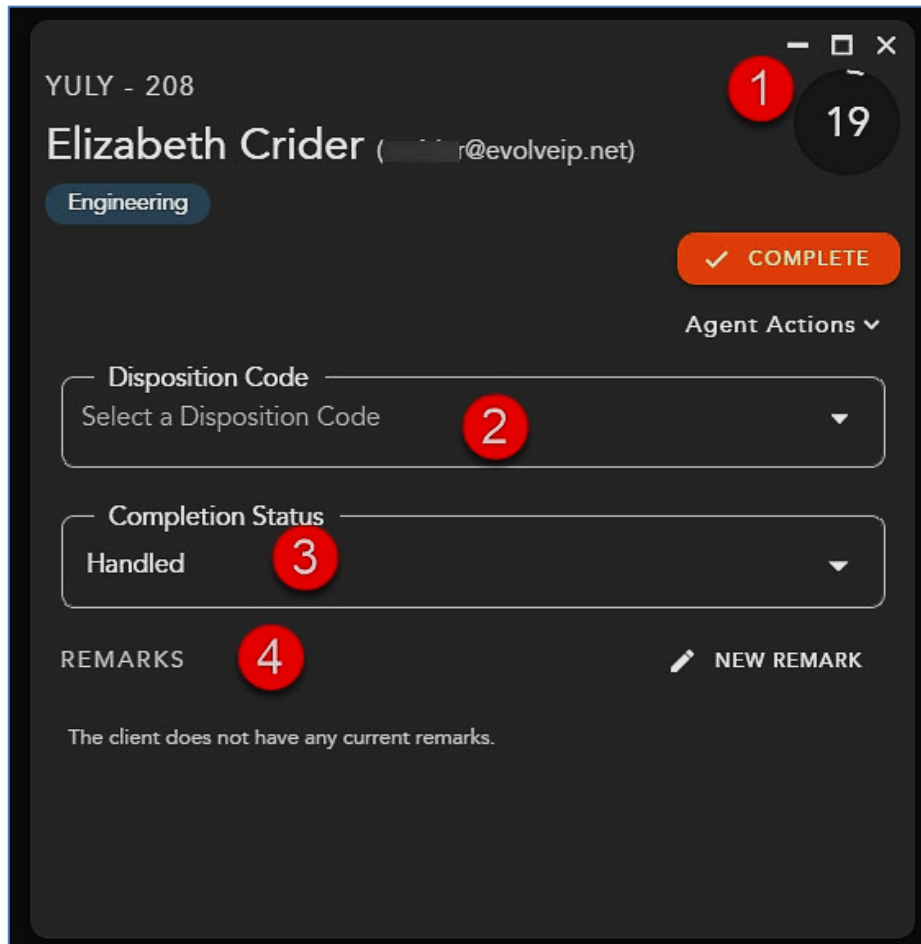

Completing an Interaction

Once an agent has sent a reply to the email interaction, the agent will automatically be put in a wrap-up state if pre-configured in the Setup Client. If no wrap-up has been configured, you will automatically be put back into a Ready state.

If Wrap-up has been configured, the following options will be available to complete the interaction.

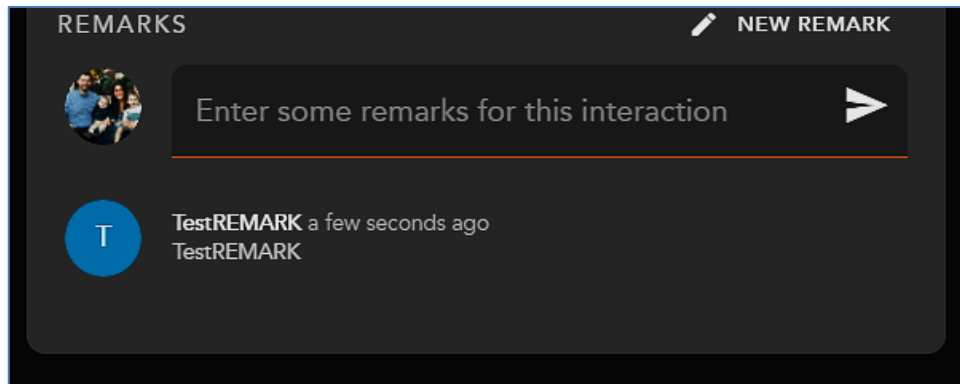
1. **Wrap-up Timer** - counts down the amount of time left in wrap-up
2. **Disposition Code** - apply a disposition code to the interaction. If no disposition codes have been configured for the originating Business Process this option will not be available. By default, your three most used disposition codes for the originating Business Process will be at the top of the disposition drop down, followed by all disposition code categories and subcategories.
 - a. If the disposition code is mandatory, that option will appear in **red**. You must select a disposition code before you can complete the interaction.



3. **Completion Status** - result of the interaction. The completion statuses available will depend on the type of interaction handled.
 - a. **Handled** - default value for completed interactions. The interaction was completed and handled.
 - b. **Delegate to Supervisor** - this option is only available if enabled for agents in the Setup Client. Once a call has ended, agents can delegate a call to a supervisor with remarks attached providing an explanation as to why the interaction has been delegated to a supervisor
4. **Remarks** - custom remarks relevant to the interaction and customer. Remarks are saved and available for review on the next interaction the customer has with the contact center and can be found in the CRM panel under *Notes and Remarks*.



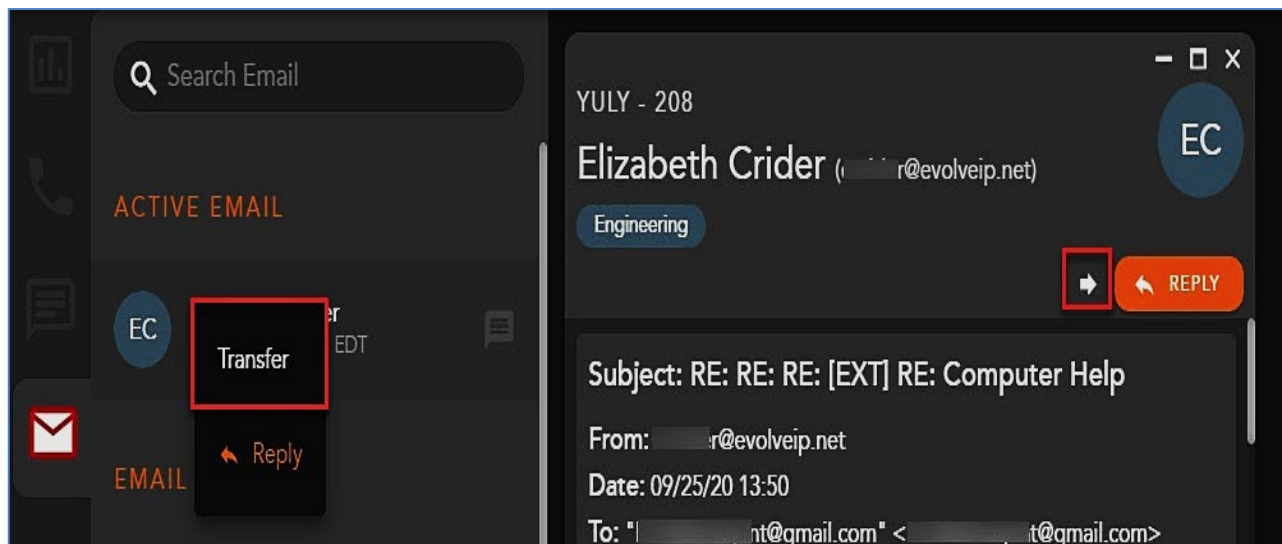

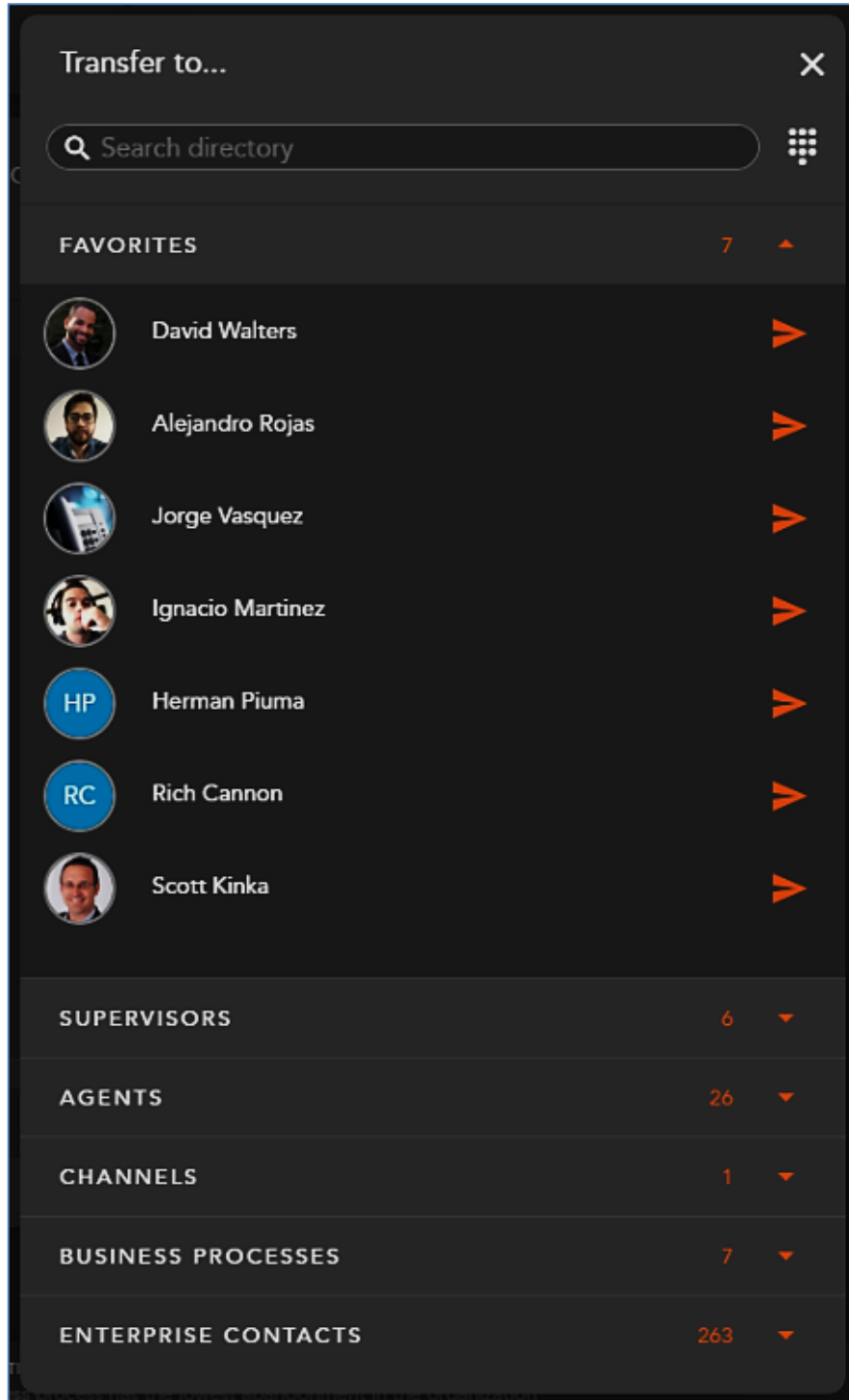
Transferring an Email

An email interaction can only be blind transferred (consulted transfer is not possible with email interactions) if the agent has not opted in to replying to the email. If the agent has already selected to send a response, they can no longer transfer the email interaction.

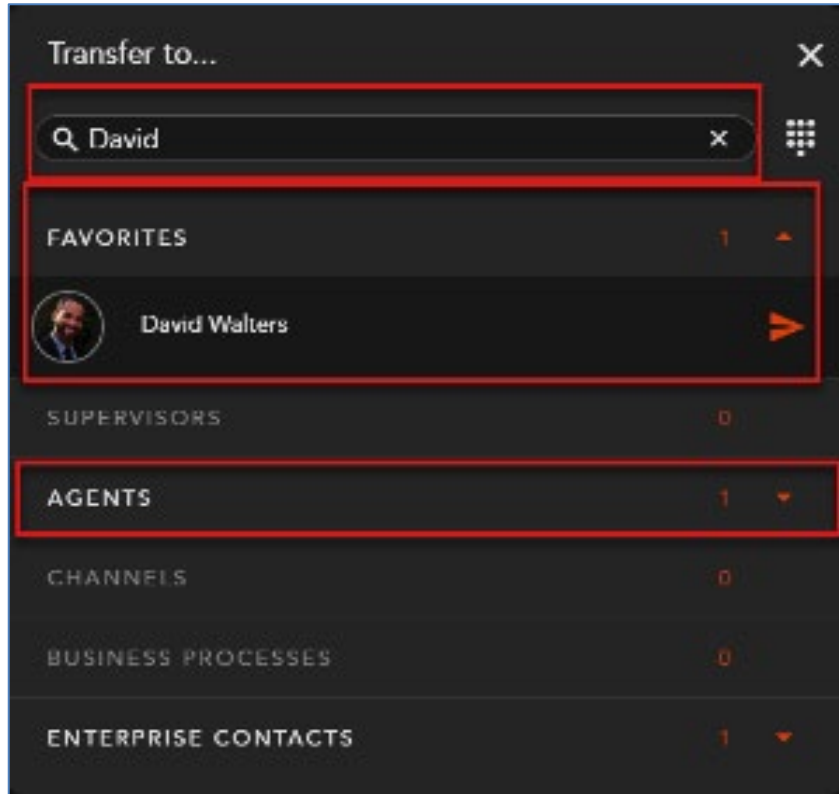
Once the email interaction has been accepted; to transfer the interaction to another Agent, Business Process, Supervisor or Channel, select the **Transfer** Icon within the email window or right-click on the active interaction in the App Side Bar.



The Transfer window will open, by default the agents favorites will be expanded.

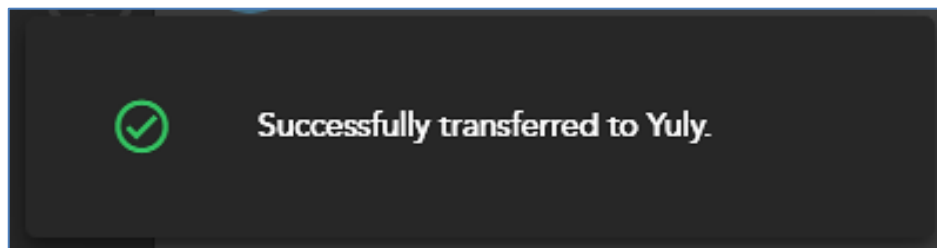

The Notifications panel currently shows the agents all their missed queued and internal interactions.

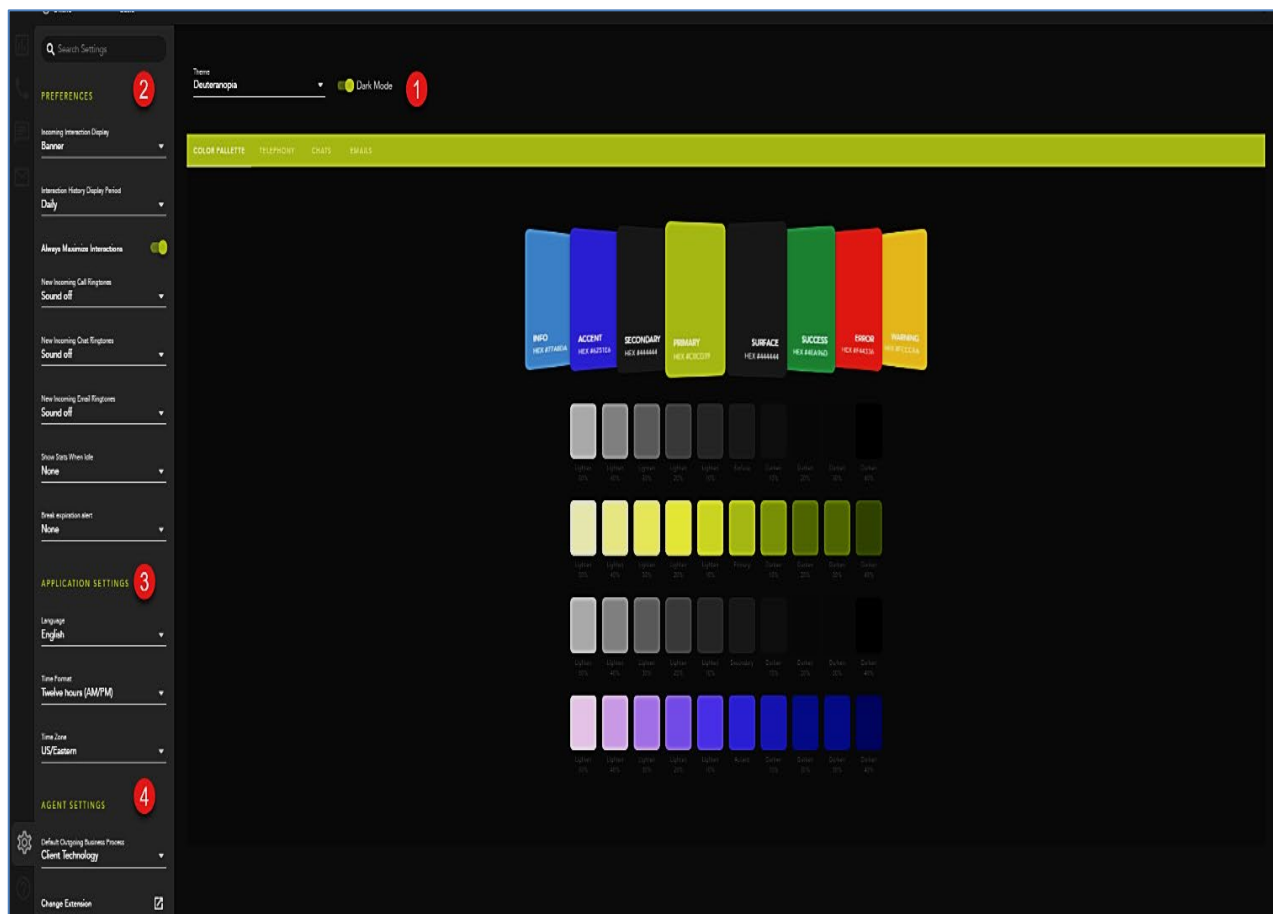


1. **Notifications Panel Icon** - Shows the total of recently missed interactions
2. **Notifications Panel** - displays the following information:
 - a. Notification Type
 - b. Timestamp of Missed Interaction
 - c. Interaction Type

- d. Contact Info: Name, Email (for missed chat interactions), Phone Number
 - e. Time
 - f. Dismiss
3. **Dismiss All** - Dismiss all Notifications from the panel. This option will appear when you have accumulated three or more notifications.

Settings

Overview



1. **Theme:** choose from multiple-colored themes for the application, as well as the dark or light mode of the theme
2. Preferences
 - a. **Incoming Interaction Display:** choose how to display and alert the agent of an incoming interaction: Banner, Panel or both Banner and Panel

- b. **Interaction History Display Period:** choose how long to display your historical interactions: Daily, Weekly, or Monthly. After selected period the interactions will be removed from your historical interaction display
 - c. **Always Maximize Interactions:** when enabled, an accepted interaction will automatically open in the maximized view
 - d. **New Incoming Call, Chat and Email Ringtones:** choose a ring tone to differentiate between the different media types offered to an agent. Selecting a ring tone is optional.
 - e. **Show Stats when Idle:** select between None, 10 seconds, 30 seconds, 1 minute or 5 minutes. If the agent sits idle on the main interaction window, it will default back to the Agent Intelligence Center after the select time-period.
 - f. **Break Expiration Alert:** select between None, 10 seconds, 30 seconds, 1 minute or 5 minutes. If an agent is on break and it has an expiration, this will alert the agent when the break expiration is approaching.
3. Application Settings:
- a. **Language** - default language of application upon login
 - b. Time Format:
 - c. Twelve Hours (AM/PM)
 - d. Twenty-four hours (00:00)
 - e. **Time Zone** - default time zone for application
4. Agent Settings:
- a. **Default Outgoing Business Process** - Any outgoing call or chat requires a Business Process for caller-ID purposes. By default, the Business Process chosen is the based on alphabetical order. If never changed, this Business Process will always be the caller-ID out pulsed when making an outgoing chat or call. Selecting from the drop down will allow the agent to change which Business Process caller-ID they wish to out pulse. This change will be saved and remain the default until changed.
 - b. Change Extension
 - c. Default - the default extension is configured in the setup client and will be the default end point used when logging into the application
 - d. Private Phone - private phone options are configured in the setup client by a supervisor or admin. If configured, this option to change your application end point to a private phone will be available, with the pre-configured numbers to choose from.
 - e. Custom - enter in a ten digit DID to route calls. This can be used if you need to work from home and need to route calls to your cell phone for the day.
